#YouSaid - **What matters to you**

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised through our surveys and engaging and talking with you at various meetings. In this quarter, we will be prioritising the following;



Priority 1. Concerns have been raised regarding an increase in vehicle crime across the beat, including theft from motor vehicles, theft of number plates, and vehicle interference. There has been a marked increase of these reports along with neighbouring beats.

We did: Local officers and Safer Streets Team are taking the lead regarding this priority. Actions to be taken include conducting targeted patrols in identified hotspots including plain clothes and high visibility, provide crime prevention advice to residents, and work with partner agencies to promote the use of anti theft measures. We will also review CCTV opportunities, engage with local garages and retailers regarding number plate security, and act promptly on any intelligence received to identify and deter offenders.



Priority 2: E-scooter and high-powered electric cycles on the Ward continue to blight the community.

This is a concern that is constantly raised by members of the community, despite high-profile guidance around the use of such vehicles in public places.

Despite increased social media reports and broadcasts on other channels, the issue surrounding illegal use of e-scooters and high-powered modified e-bikes continues.

We did: A number of operations have been conducted over the last three months which has resulted in more E-Bikes and E-Scooters seized on the beat and wider NPA.

Priority 3 : We are currently addressing concerns regarding a noticeable increase in reports of shop theft from retailers across the beat.

We did: Our focus in the coming months on working closely with local businesses to prevent further offences, identify repeat offenders, and ensure robust enforcement action is taken.



We will also be increasing patrols in the areas that you the community tell us there are problems.

If you feel that you are a victim of ASB please tell us ...there are steps we can take to deal with these issues .



Last month we introduced our latest member of the team PCSO Rianne.



Rianne has almost finished the in company phase of her training and will soon be out and about independently although she will be continuing on a neighbouring beat. It has been a steep learning curve for Rianne having come from a completely different background in her previous career but she has made good progress with PCSO Anne as her tutor and will eventually be a real asset to The Beaumont Ward.

Over recent weeks the team have had a number of reports of thefts from delivery vans and Post Office vans. We have been collecting intelligence and have made a number of arrests in relation to these thefts. The investigations are on going and our increased patrols with our team and the Safer Streets team will continue.

Earlier this month , PC Jack , PC Caitlin , SPC Aiden and PCSO Jaik attended the annual Emergency Services Day at The Abbey Pumping Station. This is always a great day with many local families attending and having fun both in the museum and out in the grounds with our Police vehicles , trying on items of uniform and protective equipment.
