#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and the following:

Your Concern:

We understand that **drug use, drug dealing**, and the associated criminal activity are causing significant concern within the community.

Our Response:

We are committed to addressing these issues by working closely with local residents, partner agencies, and community organisations to gather information, target offenders, and provide appropriate support where needed. Your safety and confidence remain our priority, and we will continue to take proactive steps to reduce harm and improve the quality of life for everyone in the area.

Your Concern: **Anti-social behaviour** is a major concern for many residents on the beat.

Our Response: We are committed to identifying those responsible and addressing their behaviour through the Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) incremental approach. This ensures proportionate and consistent action is taken, with the aim of reducing harm and improving community safety.

Your Concern: **Speeding and road safety** across the beat have been highlighted as key concerns by members of the community.

Our Response: With the Road Safety Partnership, the speed enforcement vehicle continues to be utilised to priority locations across the beat. This targeted approach aims to deter speeding, improve driver behaviour, and enhance overall road safety for all road users.

#WeDid - What we are doing

Increased Patrols Around Hotspot Areas

Over the past month I have been conducting both foot patrols and highvisibility mobile patrols across key hotspot locations on the Town South beat, including Hartopp Road, Badger Avenue, Solway Close, Casterton Road, Loxley Drive, Ullswater Road, Kestrel Close and Lake Terrace. These patrols are carried out to deter antisocial behaviour, monitor any drug related activity, and provide visibility and reassurance to residents.

Clerical and Follow Up Work

A portion of my time was dedicated to essential administrative duties, including logging recent incidents, reviewing outstanding reports, and following up on ongoing cases. Although this side of the role often goes unseen, it is vital to ensuring that investigations progress smoothly and that all information is recorded accurately.

Ongoing Investigations and Reassurance Activity

Following several reported incidents, officers have completed extensive house-to-house enquiries and carried out CCTV trawls across affected areas. This work has resulted in relevant footage being identified, secured and reviewed, and it is now being used to support ongoing investigations. In relation to an attempted burglary and a vehicle theft, further enquiries have been conducted with neighbours to gather information and identify any available CCTV. Providing reassurance to residents remains a priority, alongside offering practical crime prevention advice.

Supporting Vulnerable Individuals

A welfare check was carried out on a female experiencing a medical episode. After assessing the situation, appropriate care and support were arranged to ensure her wellbeing. Additionally, a number of Public Protection Notices (PPNs) have been submitted. These help identify individuals who may be vulnerable and ensure they receive the support they need from partner agencies. Officers have also carried out follow-up visits and continued to check in on some of our more vulnerable residents within the community.

Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour

We have been addressing ongoing anti-social behaviour (ASB) across several locations. This includes:

- Liaising with a local housing association regarding persistent ASB affecting residents on an estate
Speaking directly with young people involved in ASB, offering advice and issuing verbal warnings where appropriate
- Conducting visits to youths and their parents following reports of harassment targeting a family address, with a focus on early intervention and preventing escalation
- These proactive measures aim to improve quality of life for residents and ensure that those involved understand the impact of their behaviour.

In Summary

This has been a particularly busy and productive period, with a wide range of activity carried out to support the community. From enforcement and investigations to safeguarding and engagement, efforts remain focused on keeping the area safe and addressing the issues that matter most to residents.

Enforcement and Crime Prevention

A number of enforcement actions have been taken, including:

- **Seizure of a dirt bike** that had been causing issues within the community
 - Completion of a traffic offence report following enquiries
 - Seizure of an **abandoned vehicle under Section 165** of the Road Traffic Act due to **no insurance**. The occupants had left the scene, and investigations are ongoing
 - Completion of a crime report following an incident of criminal damage, with advice provided to the victim to reduce the risk of further incidents
- Property collected from Force Headquarters is also in the process of being returned to its rightful owner, which is always a positive outcome.

Engagement and Partnership Working

Community engagement continues to be a key focus. Officers have:

- Spent time in **local schools** building positive relationships and helping young people feel more confident approaching the police
- Attended the local **1940s weekend event**, speaking with residents and strengthening community ties
- Assisted colleagues with **ongoing investigations** across neighbouring areas

In addition, officers attended a **Joint Action Group (JAG) meeting**, working alongside partner agencies to discuss ongoing concerns and ensure coordinated plans are in place to address wider community issues.

☐ Safeguarding & Welfare

Officers responded to **mental health-related welfare concerns**, including submitting a **safeguarding report** with the individual's consent.

☐ Station Duties

- The team also supported the **front enquiry office**, handling a wide range of public enquiries including criminal reports, intelligence sharing, and general queries.

- We continue to deal with local issues such as Anti-social behaviour and safeguard vulnerable residents and cuckooing victims as and when we identify concerns.
- Our work is ongoing with local schools including engagement events.
- And lastly as 'Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers' we continue to work on and try find solutions with neighbour disputes. We also support our response colleagues and cover the front enquiry office too.
