What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and prioritized the following:

Priority 1: Rural Crime (Including burglary)

You said: Rural Crime is a priority.

What we are going to do:

Rural crime remains a priority with the Beat team working closely with Leicestershire Police Rural Crime team to tackle offenders and prevent crime before it is committed. Burglaries continue to be high this month, with officers conducting patrols during the day and night to catch offenders. Residents are reminded to stay aware and keep valuable belongings out of site.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You Said: Road Safety continues to be an issue.

What we are going to do:

Officers continue to conduct speed checks in local areas that have been reported to us hotspot of dangerous driving. We also continue to seize vehicles that are parked on the road without Tax and Notified Off road.

Officers have patrolled local schools during pick up and drop off time, reminding parents to park considerably and not to block any driveways or access points when doing the school run.

Priority 3: Antisocial Behavior

You said: Anti-social behavior was a priority.

What we are going to do:

We continue to work closely with the Hinckley and Bosworth Borough Council to tackle anti-social behavior in all forms.

As the warm weather increases, reports of anti-social behavior generally increase. Residents are reminded to be considerate of others and to not cause any behavior that others would perceive as causing harassment alarm and distress.

Hotspot areas for these issues will be continued to be patrolled and offenders will be dealt with through the incremental approach.

Officers from the Market Bosworth Beat Team had a four-legged friend patrol round with us one evening this month after she wandered to the front of the station looking a little lost. With no owner in sight, officer put out an appeal on the Market Bosworth Police Facebook page and officers took her on a little patrol in the hopes of locating her owner. Our furry crewmate seemed right at home patrolling the streets of Market Bosworth and helping us solve crime!

Fortunately for her owner, we were quickly flagged down by a concerned Member of the public who had lost their dog. Dog and best friend were quickly reunited, and our patrols continued.
