#YouSaid - What matters to you

ASB:

The community have raised the issue of Anti-Social Behaviour in various locations across the beat including Nuisance Bikes, Loud Cars and Young People.

Drug Activity:

The community have raised the issue of Drug use and dealing on the Melton Town North Beat.

Road Safety:

Complaints have been received following vehicles speeding along various routes through the beat - including Nottingham Road, Thorpe Road, Melton Spinney Road and Tennyson Way.

#WeDid - What we are doing

The Last month we have been busy out and about patrolling the local area and making sure that we take a particular focus on the beat priorities, here is a little bit about what we have been doing:

Priority 1 01/05/2025 20:00pm officers attended an incident of Anti Social Behaviour at Sainsburys the results of which have been that we have increased our patrol presence in the area.

Reports have been made of motorbikes being ridden on public land between The Welby and Staveley Road. This was highlighted on our social media channels and patrols have taken place to deter and detect this behaviour.

We have also patrolled Tesco on Thorpe Road following reports of nuisance vehicles causing annoyance and distress to local residents.

Antisocial behaviour has also been reported in Melton Country Park, in the form of young adults in vehicles at the visitor centre playing loud music near residential houses late in the evenings. Spot checks will be made in this area, and with the right evidence Section 59 notices can be put on the vehicle and the driver, giving powers to officers to seize the vehicle for a repeat offence within a 12 month period.

Priority 2 16/05/2025, a male was searched during a public order offence on Sherwood Drive and found in possession of cannabis, the result of this was a Community Resolution Order

Priority 3 05/05/2025 16:00pm a Non-stop road traffic collision on West Avenue where the offending vehicle collided with a parked vehicle, this is still currently under investigation.



Lighter Nights

With lighter nights creeping in there is historically a rise in burglary offences. Please take the following steps to reduce an opportunity for a burglar.

- close and lock all your doors and windows, even if you're only going out for a few minutes
- double-lock any door
- make sure that any valuables are out of sight
- keep handbags away from the letterbox or cat flap and hide all keys including car keys, as a thief could hook keys or valuables through even a small opening
- never leave car documents or ID in obvious places such as kitchens or hallways
- in the evening, shut the curtains and leave lights on
- if you're out all day, then it's advisable to use a timer device to automatically turn lights and a radio on. Ideally tuned into a talk radio station.
- set your burglar alarm
