A number of issues have been raised around the Night Time Economy in the Hinckley Town Centre with the use of counterfeit currency in licenced premises and retail premises and the use of fake identification in licenced premises across the town centre.  Anti-social behaviour caused by persons previously banned from licenced premises in the town centre. Shop Theft and theft from person offences in Hinckley Town Centre, including purse theft by bag dipping.	A male has been arrested, see below for details.
There has been a pattern of anti-social behaviour which has been identified as a current community issue occurring in the location of Hinckley Town Centre.	Officers have been out on foot patrolling the area stopping youths and adults riding their bikes in the pedestrianised area.

### News

A young boy was taken to hospital after falling through a roof at Stockwell Head in Hinckley. Officers attended after reports were received of children playing on the roof. Fire, East Midlands Ambulance Service and Police all attended. The child luckily had no obvious injuries but was taken to the hospital for precautionary checks. The Fire Service very kindly secured the building and temporarily patched up the hole on the roof.



We have been out and about doing further patrols on Castle Street ready for the school kick out time. We have been stopping youths and adults from riding their bikes in the pedestrianised area after a reported incident last week.

We attended an incident at The Crescent where a report came in regarding an aggressive male, who had attempted to shoplift multiple bottles of alcohol

(must've been thirsty). All items were returned to the store, and the male was arrested at the scene.
