Drug Offences	<p>PC Jodie continues to stop check people for the smell of drugs coming from vehicles and if she suspects dealing / smoking of drugs.</p> <p>We continue to work with the locals who report people drug dealing within your areas and support where necessary.</p> <p>We build intelligence in order to stop drug dealing / smoking in your areas.</p>
Burglary	<p>Households and businesses premises being broken into, because of insecure premises, opportunistic thieves who look for easy entry points or items visible to steal and signs that a property is not occupied.</p> <p>Working with the public, by giving safety advise to ensure that they do not get burgled or vehicles not broken into.</p> <p>Working with other professionals to give support.</p>
Anti-Social Behaviour	<p>Ongoing work with neighbours over neighbourhood disputes, to ensure all parties have a happy workable resolution..</p> <p>Working with the schools to support youths around safety when riding a bicycle.</p> <p>Patrolling our areas to ensure safety of all people involved.</p>

News

- ◆ PC Jodie has been doing proactive patrols around our areas, with some words of advise given to a group of anti-social youths in Blaby.
- ◆ PCSO Kirsty got to say hello to the Beavers briefly, whilst they were learning everything about St Andrews Church.
- ◆ Intelligence was logged with regard to two motorbikes driving at exceedingly fast speeds through Kilby on Mothers' Day, followed by a vehicle.
- ◆ Report received of a stolen vehicle at an address - checks were completed, and everything appeared good.
- ◆ Support given to a gentleman that felt isolated because he was not given any support with his disability and again with another lady who needed some support emotionally.
- ◆ In Countesthorpe on Mothers' Day, we had a report of a serious job, involving three youths. We send our wishes to the people involved. Just prior to this incident, these youths stole items from Countesthorpe Co-Operative. These youths were arrested for both offences.
- ◆ Received a report of a person needing support in Kilby. We made a referral through to Blaby District Council to assist.
- ◆ We have had two reports of burglary to a home within our areas more recently and a vehicle stolen.
- ◆ Report in of someone cutting trees down belonging to another person, without their permission - we are investigating this.
- ◆ Second hand information received regarding some drug dealing that is going on in Countesthorpe - we are working on this.
- ◆ Reports received of youths throwing stones at vehicles in Countesthorpe - PC Jodie said the investigation is on-going.
