#YouSaid - What matters to you

Beat Priorities for October/November/December 2025



1) OP PEDALFAST - Measham

Operation Pedalfast is a targeted initiative by Leicestershire Police aimed at tackling the illegal use of e-scooters and e-bikes.

We are aware of reports of anti-social behaviour involving e-bikes in the areas of High Street and Wigeon Drive, Measham.

Officers will be conducting regular patrols in these locations to address concerns and ensure public safety.

Where appropriate, Section 59 notices will be issued. These notices allow police to seize vehicles being used in a manner that causes alarm, distress, or annoyance to the public.

2) Anti-Social Vehicle Use - Rural villages

We are aware of concerns regarding anti-social vehicle use in our rural villages including Newton Burgoland, Swepstone, and Snarestone.

Our officers will be actively monitoring these areas, and anyone found driving in a disruptive or dangerous manner will be dealt with accordingly.

3) HGV Vehicles breaching the weight limit—Occupation Road, Albert Village

There are continued issued surrounding HGV's travelling through the village in contravention of the weight limit.

We continue to receive reports in relation to this. The beat team are increasing patrols in the area and completing vehicle stops when appropriate.

We have a day of action planned where the beat team will spend time in the local area and complete enforcement where deemed appropriate.

BEAT PRIORITY UPDATE

Op Pedalfast - To target the use of illegal e-bikes and e-scooters.

We have completed a planned operation within the beat where a number of e-scooters have been seized by officers and will remain with our recovery agents. Officers have engaged with local schools to offer education to young people using e-bikes and scooters. We have further planned operations to continue to address the use.

HGVs breaching Weight Limit in Albert Village

We continue to receive reports in relation to this. A day of action took place, we are pleased to report that only 2 vehicles were monitored and both were delivering in the area.

PC Russ visited Spring Cottage to monitor the HGV's, he visited a couple of different spots for a little under an hour. During that time no HGVs were seen within the weight limit. Further checks will be carried out at alternative days and times to check compliance.

Anti-social vehicle use in local rural villages.

We are working with colleagues in our Rural Beat Team and will be holding a drop in session to be held in Newton Burgoland in the near future. We are still working with local communities to identify those mis-using our rural spaces

The winning designs have now been turned into road safety posters and will be displayed around Albert Village and the local area to remind motorists to drive responsibly. To further support safety, every pupil also received high-visibility items.
