#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and the following:

Your Concern:

We understand that drug use, drug dealing, and the associated criminal activity are causing significant concern within the community.

Our Response:

While we will continue to take firm and decisive action against those who are involved, we are equally committed to engaging with individuals affected by drug use. We aim to identify appropriate interventions and support services that can help them make positive changes.

Your Concern: Anti-social behaviour is a major concern for many residents on the beat.

Our Response: We are committed to identifying those responsible and addressing their behaviour through the Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) incremental approach. This ensures proportionate and consistent action is taken, with the aim of reducing harm and improving community safety.

Your Concern: Speeding and road safety across the beat have been highlighted as key concerns by members of the community.

Our Response: With the Road Safety Partnership, the speed enforcement vehicle continues to be utilised to priority locations across the beat. This targeted approach aims to deter speeding, improve driver behaviour, and enhance overall road safety for all road users.

#WeDid - What we are doing

Assisting with a Search Following a Theft

PCSO 6160 Amanda and PCSO 6193 Fen (Melton Town Centre Beat) in a search for a female wanted in connection with a recent theft. Thanks to effective communication and coordinated teamwork, she was located without delay and dealt with in accordance with the appropriate procedures.

Clerical and Follow Up Work

A portion of my time was dedicated to essential administrative duties, including logging recent incidents, reviewing outstanding reports, and following up on ongoing cases. Although this side of the role often goes unseen, it is vital to ensuring that investigations progress smoothly and that all information is recorded accurately.

Arrests Made for Sexual Offence and Theft

PC Hill working alongside PC Baxter and Sgt Granger, arrested a male on suspicion of a sexual offence. He was taken directly into custody.

Later that evening, on our way back to the station and already past our scheduled finish time, we identified another male outside the station who was wanted in connection with two theft from store offences. He was swiftly arrested, with support from our Response colleagues, and taken into custody.

Neighbourhood Patrols and Ongoing Investigations

On Sunday, PC Hill was out on patrol with PC O'Rourke from the Melton Town North beat. They began the day by interviewing a suspect involved in a malicious communications offence relating to a neighbour dispute.

Later that afternoon, they attended a mental health related incident, working alongside partner agencies to ensure the individual involved received the appropriate support and care.

Yesterday, again partnering with PC O'Rourke, they have made further progress on ongoing investigations. This included speaking with a male regarding possession of a Class B drug and following up on another neighbour dispute within the community.

Foot Patrols in Hotspot Areas

One of the key priorities upon my return was conducting high visibility foot patrols across several hotspot locations identified through recent reports and community feedback. These patrols allow us to monitor emerging issues, deter potential offending, and speak directly with residents about any concerns they may have.

During these patrols, I had the opportunity to speak with numerous members of the community. These conversations are invaluable, as they help shape our policing priorities and ensure that local voices remain at the centre of our decision making.

Parking Complaint Resolved

I responded to a report of a vehicle causing an obstruction at a junction, creating difficulties for both drivers and pedestrians. Issues of this nature can pose a genuine safety risk, particularly in areas with reduced visibility.

The situation was addressed promptly, and the vehicle was moved, restoring safe passage. I would like to thank those who reported the matter. Your awareness and willingness to report concerns contribute significantly to maintaining safety across the area.

Patch Walk with East Midlands Housing

I carried out a patch walk alongside East Midlands Housing Officer, Zainab, focusing on Badger Avenue and the surrounding estate. This was arranged in response to an ongoing complaint regarding a motorbike causing disturbance and nuisance within the neighbourhood.

During the walk, we spoke with residents to gain further insight into the issue and to offer reassurance. These conversations are essential in helping us understand the impact on the community and in shaping an effective, long term solution.

☐ Crime & Patrols

We have been supporting our response teams with **live incidents** throughout **February** too and completing high visible patrols often on foot in some of our hotspot areas.

Teamwork with other beat officers from our neighbouring beats, assisting them with visiting vulnerable persons, dealing with suspects of criminal activity and ongoing neighbour disputes.

☐ Safeguarding & Welfare

Officers responded to **mental health-related welfare concerns**, including submitting a **safeguarding report** with the individual's consent.

☐ Station Duties

- The team also supported the **front enquiry office**, handling a wide range of public enquiries including criminal reports, intelligence sharing, and general queries.

- We continue to deal with local issues such as Anti-social behaviour and safeguard vulnerable residents and cuckooing victims as and when we identify concerns.
- Our work is ongoing with local schools including engagement events.
- And lastly as 'Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers' we continue to work on and try find solutions with neighbour disputes. We also support our response colleagues and cover the front enquiry office too.
