What Matters to You

With data provided by our local community we have decided on our 3 beat priorities.

Priority 1:– Road Safety - This continues to be our top priority based on NHL feedback and we are focused on issues such as Speeding, illegal E-bikes and e-scooters.

Priority 2: - You've told us through surveys and local engagement that there are issues around the **anti-social and dangerous use of motorbikes, e-scooters and cars in the area of Braunstone park** and the surrounding road network

Priority 3 - You've told us through surveys and local engagements that there are issues around **drug use and supply at various locations across the beat, and the associated Anti-Social Behaviour.**

Road Safety and Speed What We have done #YouSaidWeDid

You have said Road Safety was still your top priority based on the returns from the Community Surveys. The beat team are in contact with the Safer Roads Team which operate out of FHQ at Enderby and are a dedicated team of officers and staff who conduct campaigns and operations to target and educate as well as enforce against those who continue to break the law under the Road Traffic Act. As this is an ongoing issue we will be looking to utilise the teams experience along with the Speed Camera Enforcement Van in identifying locations and targeting the drivers who flout the law.



Tackling nuisance motorbikes/E-scooters What We have done #YouSaidWeDid



Your local beat team have continued to follow up on any reports of nuisance motorbikes. The team have again this month focused on key area's such as Braunstone Park and Great Central Way as we have received reports of nuisance motorcycles in those areas. We continue to recover stolen motorcycles on the beat area that predominantly are stolen elsewhere and are found on our section.

In relation to those riders who continue to cause anti-social behaviour we will continue with our tactics to identify them and utilise powers under Police Reform Act, Road Traffic Act and use ASB powers to prosecute and seize the vehicles where we can.

Drug Use and Dealing associated at known Hotspot addresses in the Neighbourhood What We have done #YouSaidWeDid

Following on from last month's success stories around evictions and possession of addresses related to Drug Use and Dealing we have continued to work closely with our partner agencies. An address of concern in the area of Haworth Place has been highlighted to the police this month and persons known to us have been sighted at this address and are linked to Drugs. At this time we are working with the relevant housing provider, social services and the tenant to identify and address any safeguarding issues and educate them in what action will be taken against them should evidence of Drug use or Dealing be identified at their home address.

As a further update on the address in Gaskell Walk where court action had been taken against the tenant I can add that a Possession Order has now been filed with the courts and we will await a decision to be made where hopefully in the coming months we will know the final outcome.

ASB in our Community

Over the past month of July we have seen a slight rise in reports of Anti-social Behaviour.

Several reports in the area of Odam Close that has caused Harassment, Alarm or Distress to local residents and the Police are currently working with Leicester City Council Community Safety Team around Legal Sanctions for the identified persons.

Youths throwing in Ellesmere Road and Folville Rise, including at Folville Primary, and whilst some of the youths have been identified there is more work to be done to stop this behaviour. Those identified so far have been spoken to with their parents and issued advise letters stating that if it continues further sanctions against them will be sought, including court action.
