What matters to you

From information collated from local surveys, beat knowledge, intelligence and reports to Leicestershire Police, the following areas have been highlighted as priorities within the community:

Priority 1: Anti-social behaviour, including rowdy behaviour and drug use, in the area of Gilmorton Avenue

You said: Anti Social Behaviour is an issue and Drug use in the area of Gilmorton Avenue.

We did: Consultations in the local area, we have executed a warrant at two addresses and submitted intelligence for drug use in the area. All of this has been achieved by regular high-visibility patrols by both PCSO's and PC's.

• Priority 2: Vehicle crime in the area of Morcom Drive

You said: There has been an increase of Vehicle crime in and around the area of Morcom Drive.

We did: High-visibility patrols in the area. There have been no further reports of vehicle crime in the area.

Priority 3: Anti-social behaviour and vehicle crime in the area of Park Hill Drive

You said: Increase of Anti Social Behaviour on Park Hill Drive.

We did: Consultations in this area, no issues have been raised and high-visibility patrols conducted. A call had come into police due to an individual trying car doors, he was later arrested by police and was found in possession of a knife.

Other Local News

Joint policing effort locates missing person in mental-health crisis

A coordinated policing response led to finding a missing person in a mental-health crisis. The individual has been reported earlier in the day, with growing concerns for their welfare. The Aylestone Police team conducted foot patrols in the area and soon found the person standing next to a busy road.

Officers assessed the situation and determined that the use of section 136 powers of the Mental Health act were necessary to ensure the individuals safety. The person was taken into protective care where they were able to receive the help and support they needed.



PCSO's take action on speeding drivers

Police Community Support Officers were recently given new traffic powers to enable them to issue tickets for a variety of offences including speeding!

PCSO's were on a local road in the Aylestone area conducting speed checks which caught people exceeding the 30mph speed limit, with excess speeds of up to 40 & 50mph! People faced enforcement action along with fixed penalty tickets.
