What matters to you

- **Anti Social Behaviour** —You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, parties, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and prevent them occurring again.
- **Motor vehicle crime**—You told us that you were concerned about vehicle crime. This can be theft of motor vehicles or theft from motor vehicles, this also includes theft of tools from vans and theft of catalytic convertors.
- **Road Safety**—You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance, MOT and driving offences.

- **Anti Social Behaviour**—The local neighbourhood team conduct regular patrols in highlighted problem areas. Officers will advertise on our social media channels when they are out and about patrolling. We record all ASB on our shared system with Harborough District Council and together we will do what we can to reduce problems and provide you with the satisfaction. We continue to encourage you to report concerns and locations to us, we need this information to conduct more targeted patrols.
- **Road Safety**—the local beat team regularly conduct speed checks and deal with any traffic issues that are reported on the beat. We endeavour to update via social media or Neighbourhood Link when we complete these duties.

Great Work:

On 26th February an elderly male was reported missing around the Byre Crescent Estate in Broughton Astley. With the help of response officers, the local beat team, neighbouring beat officers and the community, the male was located safe and well in a nearby village. It was great to have everyone coming together to help find the male and make sure he was returned home safe and sound.

ASB Patrols:

Throughout February the beat team have completed patrols around the local area, checking on local parks, business premises and hotspot areas to ensure everyone is enjoying the space safely.

Good Deed of the Day:

PC 1035 was flagged down by members of the public regarding a male who was found passed out on Dunton Road in Broughton Astley after suffering a fall. Members of the public driving past stopped to help. He was given initial first aid and an ambulance called. He was treated by EMAS staff for a head injury and taken to hospital for treatment. Thank you to the people who stopped to help!

Recovered Vehicle:

After complaints of vehicles parking on pavements around the Devitt Way estate in Broughton Astley, PC 1035 patrolled the area and located this vehicle blocking the pavement. It was found to also have no TAX and as such was subsequently recovered.

Darker Nights Campaign:

 Residential burglaries can be deeply upsetting. It can be traumatic to lose valuable and sentimental items from your home and the thought of a stranger invading your property is distressing.

 Protect your home against opportunist burglars by remembering to lock up and light up.

 These darker evenings can provide the perfect cover for burglars who can easily spot an insecure window or door, or valuable left in plain sight.

 Install strong fences and gates and make sure that they are always locked. Consider adding trellis and spiky plants to the fences to make it difficult for burglars to climb over them.

 Consider installing external CCTV cameras or video doorbells. Always lock your windows and doors when you are in and out.

 Try to make your house look as occupied as possible when you are not there. Use automatic timer switches to turn lamps on and off sporadically.

 Do not leave your house and vehicle keys in the lock or on a side table in view of a window or next to a door. If you wish to obtain a faraday pouch you can visit a police station and ask for a car key pouch.

 Check your UPVC or Euro Cylinder door locks to see if they're snap resistant. It should be stamped with a three-star kite mark. For more information on this please visit the Leicestershire Police Website.

 Do not leave items in open porches that could be used to enter your home such as curved-handled umbrellas. These items could be used as "fishing" implements to use through a letter box or open window.

 If you're going away, cancel newspapers and milk. You could also ask a trusted neighbour or friend to keep an eye on your property and take your post inside.

 Use external sensor lights on your driveway / rear garden.

 Think about increasing the visibility of the entrances and exits of your home. Consider cutting back and removing large plants and bushes that restrict visibility from the road.
