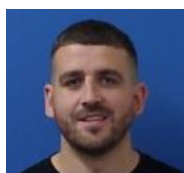

Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid

You Said	We did
The NH20 beat has issues with Anti-Social Behaviour across Enderby, Narborough, Littlethorpe, New Lubbesthorpe and Fosse Park. Anti-Social Behaviour involving the use of e-bikes, e-scooters in public spaces. This issue also covers rowdy and inconsiderate behaviours from individuals or groups in the area.	See below for a full update.
Road Safety has been identified as a beat priority from Neighbourhood Link consultation and surveys with residents on the beat. Road Safety issues we face across the beat include things like speeding, improper use of the highway such as anti-social driving, road traffic collisions (RTC) and driving without tax, MOT or insurance.	The roads policing unit have been busy last month. The officers attempted to stop an e-scooter which resulted in a fail-to-stop. The male was subsequently stopped and his e-scooter was seized
From Neighbourhood Link consultations, drug misuse and drug dealing have been identified as beat priorities. The use and distribution of drugs around the beat area has been identified as a priority. This includes issues surrounding the use of drugs and incidents caused by drug use, and also the effects of drug dealing in the beat area.	Reports have been received in relation to intelligence around Drugs in Littlethorpe and New Lubbesthorpe. The intelligence has been submitted and Officers will develop this.

News

The team, as always, have been very busy over the past few weeks. The school summer holidays and the very hot weather have increased demand. There have been numerous reports of issues at Fosse Park McDonalds with Antisocial behaviour from young people. The team have increased patrols and liaised with staff and security to tackle these issues.

We have received reports of an ongoing neighbour dispute in Enderby, this is being dealt with via the incremental approach and joint Blaby District Council working partnerships. Did you know Blaby District Council also deals with ASB?, we work closely with them in a joint effort to crack down on all ASB. We're also dealing with a number of reports in Narborough, calls were received of noise and suspicious behaviour at a property in Narborough, we have spoken to the landlord of the property involved and will be doing regular patrols in this area, Blaby District Council have also been informed.

There has been criminal damage in Narborough and Littlethorpe of graffiti on the local park equipment, the team are investigating this, if you have any knowledge please call us on 101 or contact the local Enderby, Narborough and Littlethorpe beat team via our website.

After concerns were raised around the selling of alcohol and vapes to underage children, together with the local authority we carried out a test purchase operation at three off-licensed premises in Narborough. All three stores were tested for alcohol sales and we are pleased to report that every premises passed, with staff carrying out the appropriate age verification checks. We will carry on monitoring shops across the beat and our local licensing unit will be kept informed of any further issues.

We received reports of 2 males riding a motorbike and trying car doors in Fosse Park. The pair managed to steal a motorbike. Fortunately our traffic officers, firearms officers, drone team and your local beat team flooded the area and recovered the bike with 2 males arrested. It probably wasn't the best idea stealing a bike next door to our Force Headquarters!
