We have listened to you and the concerns you have raised and we set our priorities for January, February and March to reflect this.

Priority 1: To promote safety during the night time economy

YOU SAID: You want to enjoy the Leicester City Centre nightlife and feel safe whilst doing so. You want to ensure that licensed premises are operating in accordance with their license. You want to know what we are doing to tackle violence against women and girls.

Priority 2: To tackle cycle crime and cycle related ASB in the City Centre

YOU SAID: You want to feel safe coming to the City Centre and leaving your bike locked up. You don't want to be bothered by E-bikes or E-scooters driving through the City Centre.

Priority 3: You want to enjoy the Town Hall Square, Granby Street, Belvior and surrounding area but ASB caused by people and vehicles prevents this.

YOU SAID: You want to enjoy the Town Hall Square and surrounding area but ASB is a concern.

What have we done? #WeDid



To promote safety during the night time economy we have focused our efforts on ensuring city centre locations are promoting the licensing objectives, deploying officers into the night time economy, promoting safer nights outs and the Ask Angela campaign and tackling violence against women and girls.

To highlight some of the work and results we have achieved; 1 premise has had their license revoked, 2 further premises subject to revocation hearings, 5 written warnings issued, deployment of the 'mobile police station' to busy night time economy locations.

To tackle cycle crime and relates anti-social behaviour we have continued to deploy operation Pedalfast. We have now seized a total of 724 illegal vehicles and made 52 arrests for offences including drugs possession, assault and theft.

To tackle cycle theft we have been holding regular bike marking events to prevent and deter theft. We also have project Re-lock so if you are the victim of cycle theft you attend our front enquiry office and to help get you back on the saddle we can provide a gold standard D-lock and bike marking free of charge.



We remain committed to tackling anti-social behaviour at the Town Hall Square, Granby Street and Belvior Street area. We have conducted operations in the area to tackle drug use, drug dealing and vehicle related anti-social behaviour. We have significantly increased our presence in the area resulting in an increase in stop searches and arrests for drugs offences. We have issued traffic tickets and seized vehicles. We are currently working with partners to target harden the area and increase guardians.

Other news

Our very own PC Tom has been awarded an internal award for neighbourhood officer of the year. This is down to his dedication for making the City Centre a safer place. Well done!



Our NPA commander Insp Ludlam met with Stephen Bryan JP, the High Sheriff of Leicestershire to discuss Policing, crime trends and how to support vulnerable people in the City Centre.
