What we have done over the last 3 months

PARKING:

The beat team have been conducting joint operations with the council to educate residents and enforcement where necessary.

ASB:

The beat team have worked closely with the local authority to design out part of the problem, we have had benches removed where people who cause ASB congregate. We have had the hedges cut back to increase visibility from the main roads surrounding the park and improved lighting, ultimately making the park feel safer.





What we are doing cont'd...

VIOLENT CRIME:

Over the past 3 months your beat team have identified two properties where the occupants are being taken advantage of by drug dealers. We have safeguarded these individuals. We will work with housing and the local authority to proactively identify other vulnerable people with a view of safeguarding them.

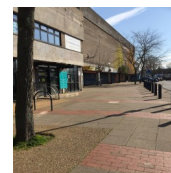
