Drug offences including drug use and supplying has been identified as a neighbourhood priority.	Intelligence has been submitted in relation to drugs being supplied from a property on our beat. At present we are unable to comment further whilst this intelligence is developed.
Business & Residential Burglaries	A burglary has occurred in Stoney Stanton whereby the perpetrators have entered through a window at the back of the property and obtained keys to their vehicle. The vehicle was stolen. This has been passed to CID whom are completing relevant enquiries.
