### Tesco Superstore

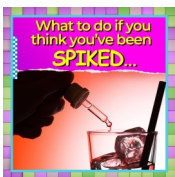


We continue to liaise with the staff at Tesco Superstore to provide reassurance to the local customers and take positive action against offenders. Patrols will continue for the foreseeable future.
