Road Safety including car cruising, anti-social driving and vehicle safety has been highlighted by the public as an issue.	Operation Spinner patrols have taken place in response to vehicle related anti-social behaviour including regular car meets and street racing.

Following reports from members of the public, officers attended an incident in Glen Parva involving a motorcycle that had been abandoned by its rider in the street. After carrying out enquiries, the motorcycle was found to have been reported stolen. We are pleased to confirm that the bike has now been recovered by police. If you witness anything suspicious or have concerns in your area, please continue to report them to us.

While the vast majority of young people enjoy their holidays responsibly, we'll be spending time in these locations, speaking with residents, engaging with young people and helping to prevent anti-social behaviour where it occurs. We're pleased to report a reduction in ASB around Station Street, Whetstone, following engagement with those involved and the issuing of ASB warning letters. Thank you to everyone who has reported issues and shared

information with us. We're also aware of concerns regarding vehicle-related ASB on Henson Close, Whetstone, and are continuing to work with partner agencies to identify those involved and take appropriate action.

As the warmer weather continues, we'd also like to remind everyone to take care around the Grand Union Canal and River Sence in Glen Parva. Open water can be unpredictable, so please avoid taking unnecessary risks and look out for one another. If you witness anti-social behaviour or have concerns in your area, please report it via 101 or online at www.leics.police.uk. In an emergency, or if a crime is in progress, always call 999.
