Some of our PCSO's that cover a part of the Blaby District are being reassigned beats! You may recognise PCSO 6592 Danny (pictured left) and PCSO 6028 Ryan (pictured right). With PCSO 6592 Danny moving, he has covered the NH20 Beat (Narborough, Enderby, Littlethorpe and New Lubbethorpe) for the last two and half years and further to this PCSO 6028 Ryan has covered the NH24 Beat (Fosse Villages) for the last four years. The shuffling of PCSO's will see PCSO 6592 Danny move to the Fosse Villages and take over PCSO 6028 Ryan as he will be moving on to the NH19 (Braunstone Town & Thorpe Astley) beat. Along with this news, we also see a new face joining the role of a PCSO of whom we wish to introduce you to. Please welcome PCSO 6120 Dan (pictured in the middle) who will be taking over from PCSO 6592 Danny on the NH20 beat. Admittedly, getting the two Dan's mixed up is expected...It's already caused a bit of confusion in the station! Please make sure to stop us, have a chat, take some photos and ask any burning questions you may have for us.



It's been busy few weeks for the team. Here is some of what we've been up to recently:-We Took part in Leicestershire Police's Operation to facilitate Remembrance Day Safely with a number of officers attending and laying wreaths. We were contacted by Royal Mail who had intercepted approximately 11kg of cannabis being sent to addresses from abroad, we have submitted intelligence around this which will likely lead to enforcement at a later date. We assisted with a serious incident on Aikman Avenue, New Parks and referred a homeless person to a multi agency meeting and completed several welfare checks. We have completed various training courses including one that increases the powers for PCSO's to deal with traffic issues. This will allow the beat team to deal with the Road Safety concerns of residents more robustly going forwards. Sgt Cooper has been liaising with CID in relation to an investigation to a burglary providing valuable information and organising the arrest of a persistent caller of note which will serve to allow the beat teams to concentrate on other policing.
