# **#YOU SAID, WE DID**

You said: Rural crime is a priority.

**We did:** As a Beat Team, we have received multiple reports of loose animals in the local area escaping. Upon attendance all animals have been returned to their rightful properties with no injuries. We continue to engage with local farmers and landowners to assist with current ongoing issues especially as we go into the summer months.

You said: Anti-social behaviour was a priority.

**We did:** Members from the Market Bosworth Beat Team attended Desford following reports from Members of the public about Antisocial behaviour and Criminal damage this month. Details of those involved were obtained and an investigation is currently underway.

You said: Road safety continues to be an issue.

**We did:** Volunteers from Leicestershire Police carried out a speed operation in Fenny Drayton this month following concerns from residents and members of the public that there was a considerable amount of speeding through the village. In total 10 speeders were recorded. Details were obtained of those speeding and will be dealt with accordingly.

Following on from the success of the speeding operation in Fenny Drayton, officers from the Market Bosworth completed a speed operation alongside a MOT and Insurance check across the beat. In total, a ticket was given to a driver for no MOT, words of advice given to multiple drivers due to their speed and manner of driving. Valuable hours logged across the beat as well as some high visibility patrols completed.



#### Anti-social Behaviour in Bagworth

Recently, there has been an increase in anti-social behaviour and criminal damage around the area of Station Road in Bagworth. A persistent target of vandalism Is the play area on the park on Station Road.

Officers from the Beat team met with the local council and members of the public to discuss possible solutions to preventing any further issues as well as identifying any offenders.
