Safer Streets Summer has officially arrived in Hinckley Town Centre! As part of the Government's Safer Streets Mission, the Prime Minister announced the Neighbourhood Policing Guarantee (NPG), aimed at restoring and strengthening local policing in every community by the end of this Parliament. A key component of the NPG is restoring confidence in local communities and taking visible action tackling anti-social behaviour (ASB) and increasing the safety of our town centres and high streets. Over the next few months, you can expect to see a larger policing footprint in Hinckley Town Centre, tackling issues that mean the most to you: Retail Crime, Street Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour. If you see officers out and about on patrols or attending your local community events, then please stop and say hello.



Over the month police were on night time economy duties in Hinckley keeping it nice and safe for those who were enjoying some drinks in the beautiful British summer time weather. Revellers were having a great time and engaging with police. We also work closely with licence premises to ensure the safety of everyone who comes out for the evening in Hinckley.

Your NH25 beat team have been doing local patrols through the town alongside our regular duties. Enquires around shoplifting and criminal

damage have been made and the perpetrators have been dealt with. We have also attended a meeting with the


