What matters to you

- **Anti Social Behaviour**—You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, parties, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and prevent them occurring again.
- **Motor vehicle crime**—You told us that you were concerned about vehicle crime. This can be theft of motor vehicles or theft from motor vehicles, this also includes theft of tools from vans and theft of catalytic converters.
- **Road Safety**—You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance, MOT and driving offences.
- **Highway Obstructions**—You have told us vehicles obstructing the highway is a priority

What have we done **#yousaidwedid**

- **Anti Social Behaviour**—The local neighbourhood team conduct regular patrols in highlighted problem areas. Officers will advertise on our social media channels when they are out and about patrolling. We record all ASB on our shared system with Harborough District Council and together we will do what we can to reduce problems and provide you with the satisfaction. We continue to encourage you to report concerns and locations to us, we need this information to conduct more targeted patrols.
- **Road Safety**—the local beat team regularly conduct speed checks and deal with any traffic issues that are reported on the beat. We endeavour to update via social media or Neighbourhood Link when we complete these duties.

What have we done #yousaidwedid

ASB Patrols:

Throughout May, your local beat team have completed numerous patrols in the area. We have checked local parks, spoken to businesses and reviewed hotspot areas that the community have raised concerns with.

Areas such as Frolesworth Road park, Swannington Road industrial estate, Spar shops / Devitt Way estate and the Leire Lane fishing ponds.

These are just a few areas that the beat team have completed patrols around to deter people from ASB and to identify those causing issues.

Issues at Leire Lane Pond:

Due to the warmer weather and school half term, there have been an increased number of calls regarding people trespassing on the private land and swimming in the private fishing ponds.

On 26th May there were approximately 30-40 teenagers trespassing on the land and swimming in the water. Those we didn't run were stopped and their details obtained and letters will be sent to their parents regarding this behaviour and the risks around open water swimming.

!!Health and Safety Advice!!

With the good weather approaching, please make sure to be aware and advise your children not to swim in any open water, ponds or lakes. And not to trespass onto any land to go in the water.

We had reports last year of people trespassing onto private land to swim in ponds and lakes. This issue appears to be re-starting again this year—especially around the Leire Lane fishing pond.

This is a serious safety risk and can cause issues if someone becomes stuck in the water or goes into shock due to the cold temperatures. Cold water shock is a real risk to people and can hinder a person's swimming ability and make it harder for them to exit the water.

Already in 2026 there have been a number of water related deaths across the country linked to this type of behaviour and we do not want to see this happen.

The local beat team will be completing patrols in these areas and anyone found trespassing the land, swimming in private property or causing ASB will be dealt with accordingly.
