## What matters to you

- **Priority 1 - What you have said:**

You have stated that Anti-Social Behaviour is a concern within the Charnwood East area.

### Action taken

In response to growing concerns from residents about anti-social behaviour in the Charnwood East area, particularly in Thurmaston, a series of proactive measures have been implemented. Joint visits have been carried out at The Styles and Offranville Close, where officers engaged directly with members of the community to listen to their concerns and offer support. A leaflet drop was also completed in the area, aimed at gathering valuable intelligence related to drug use and other ASB-related issues. In addition, enquiries are ongoing into reports of youths riding quad bikes in a dangerous or disruptive manner. This behaviour not only poses a significant safety risk but also contributes to noise and general nuisance within the neighbourhood. To provide visible reassurance and deter further incidents, high-visibility patrols have been significantly increased in key hotspot areas, including Checkland Road, Thurmaston Retail Park, Hilltop Road, and Barkby. Patrols will continue at these locations, as well as any newly identified areas, to maintain a visible presence and ensure the ongoing safety of the community.

- **Priority 2 - What you have said:**

The community has also stated that speeding and parking issues are a concern at various locations throughout the Charnwood East area.

### Action taken

Speeding and parking issues have been raised as ongoing concerns by residents across several areas in Charnwood East. In response, targeted enforcement and monitoring activities have been carried out to address these issues and improve road safety. A speed and safety enforcement van has been deployed along key routes including the A607 Newark Road in Thurmaston and Melton Road in Rearsby. In addition, speed checks have been conducted on Main Street in South Croxton, with further monitoring in Queniborough and South Croxton to address persistent speeding concerns. Officers have also visited the junction of Humberstone Lane and Newarke Street following reports of drivers running red lights. These actions form part of a wider strategy to tackle road safety concerns, and further operations are planned in areas that have been highlighted by the community as needing attention.

- **Priority 3 - What you have said:**

There has been a recent increase in residential burglaries within Charnwood East area.

### Action taken

There has been no increase in burglary dwelling incidents reported this month, which is a positive development for the community. However, the team remains vigilant and continues to work closely with our CID colleagues to support ongoing investigations and provide reassurance to all affected parties. In response to recent incidents, patrol plans are being adjusted to include the areas impacted, ensuring a consistent and visible police presence. This approach aims to deter further offences, assist with enquiries, and maintain community confidence.

# The Beat Team News

Everyday your local beat team are conducting marked Police car patrols through the villages of Charnwood East. These villages are Syston, Thurmaston, Thrussington, East Goscote, Ratcliffe on the Wreake, Barkby, Barbky Thorpe, Beeby, Rearsby, Hamilton Lea, Queniborough, South Croxton and Thorpebury in the Limes.

Thank you to those who came to our beat engagements this month. Thank you to those for raising their concerns and for all the positive feedback.



Patrols have taken place around Thorpebury in the limes in relation to ASB on motorbikes and burglaries on the building sites.

On 29/05, the beat team conducted speed operations with a speed gun in locations as followed:

- Main street in South Croxton

- Main street in Queniborough.



## Crime prevention advice:

Please remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity without delay and if you feel a crime is in progress then call 999 and take this time to review your own security.

Check your lock barrels - if they do not have a 3 star rating, which are anti-snap security cylinder which provide the best protection against known cylinder attacks methods, then you could and should consider replacing/upgrading them.

Look at having a security light fitted, alongside good quality CCTV and ensure that windows and doors are left locked and secure and do not leave valuables on display - this can include empty boxes of that new PS5, iPad or similar.

Alongside this check how accessible your rear garden is - fix that lock on the gate, replace that fence panel - also a brilliant deterrent is some defensive planting around the perimeter of rear gardens.

Keep your property secure with these useful crime prevention tips



The beat team have been conducting burglary patrols around the NL61 beat, which consists of evening foot and marked car patrols throughout the villages in the residential areas. This is due to an overall increase in burglaries across Charnwood.



On 12/05, PCSO 6024 attended South Croxton council meeting, where concerns of speeding along Main street were raised. As well as this, concerns of drug dealing were raised and will be progressed by the beat team.

On 16/05 PCSO 6098 conducted a beat surgery at Elizabeth Park in Thurmaston.

On 07/05, PCSO 6024 conducted a beat engagement at the Queni bean Café in Queniborough engaging with local residents.

On 08/05, PCSO 6098 conducted a beat surgery at Syston Town square and PCSO 6024 conducted a beat surgery on 27/05 at the same location. This location allows residents to see our presence and raise any concerns or issues they have.

On 09/05, PCSO 6098 and PC 1651 attended the Rearsby parish council meeting where concerns of ASB were raised and will be progressed by the beat team.

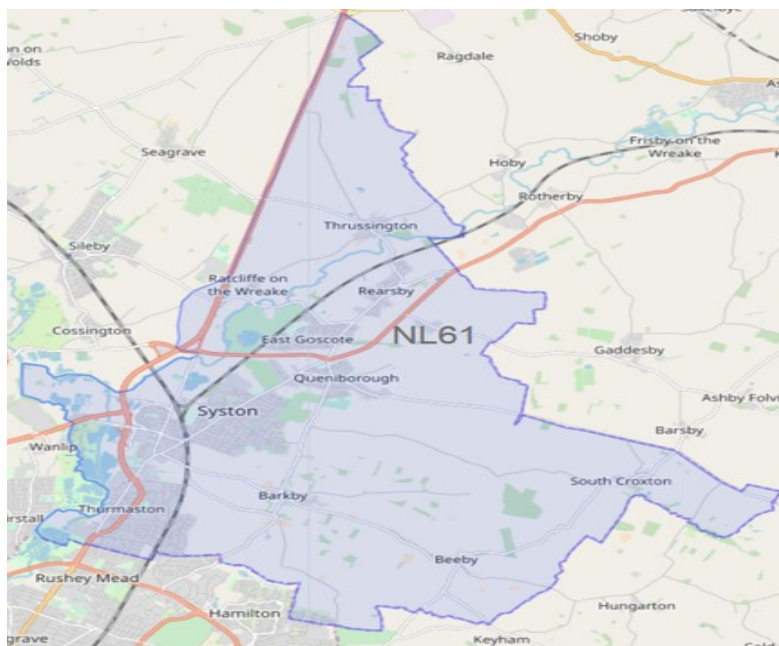
