#YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park.

You said: Anti-Social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park continues as a priority concern from the community and now with the lighter nights, we will continue to target this over the summer period.

We Did: Over the month of July we have continued to provide hot-spot patrols and re-assurance. Whilst there is still ASB in the park, there has been another significant reduction in reports. We mentioned last month that we had seen an increase in the number of small grass fires being set within the park itself. We are working closely with Leicestershire Fire & Rescue Service to tackle the issue.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You Said: From Community Surveys and Feedback on Neighbourhood Link, road safety has been highlighted to be a local concern. We will be concentrating on speeding concerns and anti-social behaviour caused by **e** bikes and off road motorbikes.

We Did: 2 vehicles parked on Braunstone Avenue have been seized for NO TAX using powers provided to the Police under DVLA guidance. We will also be looking to educate around ASB and seize any bikes where they are causing issues. An E-Bike was seized on Cort Crescent after being witnessed travelling of speeds in excess of 40MPH. Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour (Drug related)

You Said: From the Surveys on Neighbourhood Link you have told us that drug dealing and usage at addresses across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is a concern.

We Did: As promised we have carried on with targeting those people or addresses that are concerned in the use or supply of illegal drugs. A closure order at a problem address in the area of Blackmore Drive is being closely monitored. An absolute grounds for possession order was granted at court last week for another address on the estate. We continue to patrol our hotspot locations—Blackmore Drive, Audley End, Narborough Road and Winchester Avenue.

A round up of some of July's activities from the NW05 Beat Team;

- Our #SaferStreetsSummer campaign has been rolled out this month. This has seen PCSOs form the
 beat and officers from the Leicestershire Fire & Rescue Service in the area of Braunstone Park engaging with members of the community and acting as a visual deterrent for any persons looking to
 cause anti-social behaviour in the area.
- PCs from the beat attended Beaumont Leys Police Station to complete their Speed Gun Training.
 This will enable them to continue to tackle the road safety issues you have raised.
- PCSOs Beth and Geoff, along with PC Paige and PS Craig attended The Grove Community Hub at the start of the month for their Community Fun Day. This was to celebrate 25 years of b-Inspired.
 It was a wonderful event and was fantastic to see so many members of the community out enjoying the sun!
- PC Paige and PCSO Geoff attended Blackmore Drive and conducted a patch walk. Thank you to everyone that spoke to them! It was amazing to hear all of the positive feedback from residents in the area about all of the hard work the Police and Leicester City Council have done.
- PCs and PCSOs on the beat team are paying close attention to the site of the old Premier Inn on Braunstone Lane East. Since it's closure, we initially saw increased reports of trespassers on site causing damage. We worked with contractors on site, and they have now installed further security measures. This has acted as a deterrent, and we have seen a significant decline in the amount of reports received.
- We have also been working with staff at the KFC on Narborough Road. A group of youths were attending the location and causing no end of issues for the staff and customers. CCTV was viewed by PCSOs, multiple perpetrators identified and banning letters swiftly handed out. We are happy to report that the youths having been back, and there have been no further issues.
