Oadby & Wigston Police – Community Update

 **Keeping Wigston Safe**

Local officers and PCSOs have continued proactive work across Wigston, with **high-visibility reassurance patrols** taking place in key areas, including Wigston town and South Wigston.

These patrols aim to deter crime, engage with residents, and respond to concerns around anti-social behaviour (ASB).

Officers are encouraging residents to continue reporting issues, as community intelligence plays a vital role in shaping local policing priorities and ensuring timely action is taken.

 **Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)**

ASB remains a focus for neighbourhood teams. Patrols have been specifically targeted at areas where residents have raised concerns about:

- Youth disruption
- Rowdy or nuisance behaviour
- Drug use in public spaces

The beat team has reported **positive results from increased patrols**, including engagement with young people, seizure of nuisance vehicles, and collaboration with partner agencies to resolve recurring issues.

Road Safety & Traffic Enforcement

Road safety continues to be a priority across Wigston. Residents have reported issues such as speeding, dangerous driving, and obstructive parking.

In response, officers have:

- Conducted **regular traffic patrols in hotspot areas**
- Carried out vehicle stop checks based on intelligence
- Conducted speed checks to ensure road users adhere to speed limits

These operations are part of an ongoing effort to reduce dangerous driving and improve safety for all road users.

Tackling Drug-Related Activity

Local policing teams continue to address concerns around **drug use and dealing in Wigston**. Work has included:

- Intelligence-led operations and warrants
- Increased patrols in known hotspot areas
- Partnerships with other agencies to prevent ongoing issues

Recent activity has resulted in **disruption of local drug activity**, showing the importance of public information and reporting.

Burglary & Vehicle Crime Prevention

Neighbourhood officers continue working to reduce burglary and vehicle crime by:

- Conducting **targeted patrols in hotspot areas**
- Providing crime prevention advice to residents
- Developing intelligence in relation to subject vehicles and individuals

There have been **reductions in certain vehicle-related offences**, thanks in part to targeted operations and intelligence-led policing.

Residents are reminded to:

- Lock doors and windows
 - Avoid leaving valuables in vehicles
 - Report suspicious behaviour promptly

Wigston's neighbourhood team works closely with:

- Local councils
- Schools and youth organisations
- Community groups

This partnership approach helps deliver long-term solutions to local issues and improves safety across the borough. Recent engagement activity has included community patrols, youth engagement, and ongoing communication via social media and local messaging systems.
