#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and the following:

Your Concern:

We understand that drug use, drug dealing, and the associated criminal activity are causing significant concern within the community.

Our Response:

While we will continue to take firm and decisive action against those who are involved, we are equally committed to engaging with individuals affected by drug use. We aim to identify appropriate interventions and support services that can help them make positive changes.

Your Concern: Anti-social behaviour is a major concern for many residents on the beat.

Our Response: We are committed to identifying those responsible and addressing their behaviour through the Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) incremental approach. This ensures proportionate and consistent action is taken, with the aim of reducing harm and improving community safety.

Your Concern: Speeding and road safety across the beat have been highlighted as key concerns by members of the community.

Our Response: With the Road Safety Partnership, the speed enforcement vehicle continues to be utilised to priority locations across the beat. This targeted approach aims to deter speeding, improve driver behaviour, and enhance overall road safety for all road users.

#WeDid - What we are doing

Community Engagement

Traffic Enforcement Speed-calming measures have been implemented across the beat to tackle traffic offences and improve road safety.

Crime Prevention and Patrols High-visibility patrols have been conducted in response to recent incidents, alongside house-to-house visits to reassure residents. Officers have also addressed traffic offence hotspots and seized vehicles linked to investigations.

Attended training at Force Headquarters to ensure our knowledge and skills remain current, as ongoing professional development is essential for delivering a high standard of service and maintaining safer communities. In addition, PC Hill completed officer safety training—a comprehensive and physically demanding refresher designed to keep operational skills sharp and tactics up to date, ensuring officers can respond safely, confidently, and professionally when dealing with dynamic or challenging incidents.

#WeDid—What we are doing continued



Joint Action Group (JAG) Meeting

PC Hill attended our local **Joint Action Group (JAG) meeting**, which brings together **key partners** including the police, Melton Borough Council, housing providers, and other relevant agencies.

The JAG provides an **effective forum** for identifying patterns of **anti-social behaviour**, highlighting repeat locations, and recognising individuals or communities who may be vulnerable. By pooling intelligence and expertise, the group is able to **agree targeted actions**, ensure resources are deployed efficiently, and avoid duplication of work.

Theft

PC Hill interviewed a male in connection with **several theft offences** reported by a store within the beat area. Enquiries into these incidents remain ongoing as we continue to gather evidence and review further lines of investigation.

A Community Protection Warning (CPW) has been issued to the individual. This warning outlines specific conditions intended to **prevent** any further nuisance, anti-social behaviour, or offending. Should the conditions of the CPW be breached, we will consider escalating to a **Community Protection Notice (CPN)** or taking any other appropriate action in line with legislation and partnership working.

School Engagement Visit

Working closely with staff to understand **ongoing concerns** and gather intelligence. These visits enable us to identify **emerging issues** at an early stage, support young people, and plan proportionate interventions both during the school day and around **nearby hotspots**.

House-to-House Enquiries on Antisocial Behaviour

I have conducted **multiple house visits** to speak with residents and gather information relating to anti-social behaviour. Community reports **help us build a clearer picture** of what is happening, identify emerging patterns, and take **proportionate action** alongside partner agencies.

Safeguarding: Joint Visit with the Council

In partnership with **Vanessa from Melton Borough Council**, we carried out a **joint visit** to support a vulnerable woman who had been a victim of **cuckooing**. She is now doing really well. We have arranged appropriate support and continue to check in regularly. Protecting vulnerable individuals remains a core part of neighbourhood policing.

CCTV Reviews and Statements

Following a **recent theft**, PCSO Amanda has **obtained CCTV** footage and completed the necessary statements to progress the investigation. This work has resulted in the **stolen bike being reunited with its owner**.

□ **Crime & Patrols**

We have been supporting our response teams with **live incidents** throughout **January** too and completing high visible patrols often on foot in some of our hotspot areas.

Teamwork with other beat officers from our neighbouring beats, assisting them with visiting vulnerable persons, dealing with suspects of criminal activity and ongoing neighbour disputes.

□ **Safeguarding & Welfare**

Officers responded to **mental health-related welfare concerns**, including submitting a **safeguarding report** with the individual's consent.

□ **Station Duties**

- The team also supported the **front enquiry office**, handling a wide range of public enquiries including criminal reports, intelligence sharing, and general queries.

- We continue to deal with local issues such as Anti-social behaviour and safeguard vulnerable residents and cuckooing victims as and when we identify concerns.
- Our work is ongoing with local schools including engagement events.
- And lastly as 'Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers' we continue to work on and try find solutions with neighbour disputes. We also support our response colleagues and cover the front enquiry office too.
