## Beat Priorities

- ❖ **Road Safety** - Results from "my views" survey conducted by the local team, via Neighbourhood Link, indicate that this is a priority concern in the Rushey Mead area. This includes speeding, bad parking, use of mobile phones, drink and drug driving. Key locations include Gipsy Lane /Gleneagles Avenue / Peebles Way and outside local schools.
- ❖ **Anti-Social Behaviour**- Drug use and drug dealing in green and open spaces has been identified by both surveys completed and by your local beat team through various patrols within the area.
- ❖ **Reports of street drinking in the local area have been highlighted by residents**

### We're Taking Action on Road Safety -

- ❖ We have been working with partner agencies and listening to your concerns to task road safety within the Rushey Mead area.
- ❖ You will see your beat officers providing patrols at local schools at key times to improve the safety of pupils, parents and road users. we will also try to educate and enforce the laws around child car seats and the use of seat-belts.
- ❖ Multi-agency working with the council to help tackle and improve parking issues.
- ❖ We are also committed to identifying those who use vehicles without the correct documentation, such as valid driving licences and valid insurance.

### We're Taking Action on ASB -

- ❖ The beat team will continue to develop intelligence based on drug dealing within the Rushey Mead area.
- ❖ Local officers will conduct stop searches where grounds apply and show a high visibility presence within the area.
- ❖ We will actively engage with members of the public and encourage you to inform us of the concerns that you have.
- ❖ Our hot spot areas for drug issues includes areas of the Three Kilns Car park, Sandfield Close and Lockerbie Avenue. Officers have focused on these areas and will continue to.

### We're Taking Action on Street Drinkers -

- ❖ Our Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers will look to focus on dealing with this rising trend and the types of anti-social behaviour which stems from it.
- ❖ Officers have liaised with the council and have completed patch walks within the located areas

We recently welcomed PC 747 Keymer to the Rushey Mead Neighbourhood Policing Team.

PC Keymer will be out and about across the area, carrying out high-visibility patrols, engaging with residents, listening to local concerns, and working with partners to help keep Rushey Mead a safe and welcoming place for everyone.



PC Bramley and PCSO McKeown completed a multi-agency patch walk with Leicester City Council Park Ranger Andy.

We visited our green spaces on our patch walk including Appleton Park, Rushey Fields and Watermead Park.

Throughout our visit in Watermead Park we were made aware of some criminal damage and arson that has been happening in the wooden area. Intelligence has been submitted and the team will aim to complete regular patrols within the area.



PC Wallis and PCSO Birt held a successful beat surgery at Rushey Mead Library where a number of residents came and spoke to them about neighbourhood policing, what matters to them on their neighbourhood and for crime prevention advice.

Information was also given to the officers for matters concerning our partner agencies and this information has been passed onto them.

In the month of May we had our knife-crime awareness week. Officers completed knife sweeps in in hotspot locations.

These proactive patrols help to remove dangerous items from our communities, reduce risk, and support safer neighbourhoods for everyone.
