Burglaries have been highlighted as a local concern. Burglaries are an invasion of privacy. Cars and other valuables are targeted and it can often make victims feel vulnerable.	Please see update below.
Drug Offences is seen as a high priority for the residents of the Fosse Villages. As of April it has been raised as a new priority taking over previous concerns.	There have been reported issues of drug use/dealing with the Fosse Villages. Officers have been using a heat gun and obtaining intelligence in relation to this.
Nuisance motorbikes has been raised as a priority issue for residents of the Fosse Villages. Reports of nuisance motorbikes where reported is a strong issue for residents as they can cause a significant level of risk to other road users and pedestrians when they are used on the road and driven dangerously or at excess speed. This is a particular issue on Pougher Close, Sapcote.	A specific location has been identified on the beat by a local parish council. A speeding operation has been planned.

News

Officers from the beat held a beat surgery at Elvesthorpe Village Hall, Wilkinson Lane, Elvesthorpe this month. We welcomed members of the public who came along to speak to the local beat team and told us about issues or concerns they had. PCSO Ryan gave away crime prevention items such as window alarms and faraday pouches to keep your valuables safe. Please come along to the next surgery. Details below.

A high value burglary was reported in Croft recently. Valuables including watches, jewellery and alcohol believed to be over £30K were amongst items taken. Local Officers completed house to house enquiries and a CCTV trawl. Very good footage has been obtained of the 2 suspects and Officers are looking to identify both males.



A 2 vehicle road traffic collision occurred at the staggered junction on the A5 between Magna Park and Wibtoft, both vehicles were significantly damaged but luckily there were no reported injuries. We would like to express our thanks to the members of the public who stopped and helped prior to our arrival.
