#YouSaid - What matters to you.

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in July 2025.

Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

You said: you have been telling us about what anti-social behaviour is of concern to you. This can include anything from excessive noise, drug usage, parties and many more. Your local Beat Team works closely with partner agencies such as the council and housing to ensure that we can tackle this behaviour and prevent it from recurring.

Priority 2: Motor vehicle crime

You Said: you told us that you were concerned about vehicle crime this includes anything from theft of vehicle to theft from vehicle.

Priority 3: Road Safety

You Said: You have told us that road safety is a priority, this includes speeding, dangerous driving, no insurance, no MOT, no tax and more.

We've increased **ASB patrols around Lutter-worth Cemetery** following reports of disruptive behaviour. Our presence is aimed at maintaining the cemetery as a respectful and peaceful space for all visitors.



Police Message: Never Leave Dogs in Hot Cars
