Your Dedicated Neighbourhood Team (DNT) is a group of local Officers dedicated to serving your community. The team is made up of Officers based in your area and supported by the wider Policing family.

Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you.

You Said	We did
<b>Concerns relating to Road Safety whether it be parking, speeding or loud cars/bikes a causing nuisance or being ridden in an anti-social manner.</b>	Over the past few weeks, officers have been carrying out targeted patrols across the beat in response to ongoing concerns around parking and road-related issues. Particular attention has been given to school areas during peak drop off and pick up times, where several vehicles were found parked inconsiderately or creating unnecessary obstructions. Drivers have been spoken to, advice has been given, and warnings issued where appropriate.
<b>Drug dealing on the beat is still a priority. We are always looking for opportunities to gather sufficient intelligence to enforce by way of drugs warrants. Any opportunity to disrupt drug dealing will be grasped by the team and the NPT (Neighbourhood priority team). We continue to welcome any information concerning local drug dealing activities in your area.</b>	See below
<b>ASB incidents such as: Vehicle nuisance or inappropriate use. Rowdy or inconsiderate behaviour. Littering or drugs paraphernalia.</b>	At the start of February we had four reports of ASB around the beat. We will be liaising with Platform housing as there is an on going issue in relation to the smell of cannabis inside a block of flats. Patrols have been conducted by the beat team at places brought to our attention from beat surgeries.

## News

Two men have been charged with firearms offences after officers were deployed to two addresses in Stoney Stanton and Earl Shilton on Tuesday 10 February. Gareth Warland, 44, of High Street, Earl Shilton, has been charged with possession of an imitation firearm with intent to cause fear of violence. Kierell Woollery, 27, of Victoria Road, Stechford, Birmingham has been charged with possession with intent to supply a class A drug and possession of criminal property. The charges relate to a report of a man being threatened with a firearm in Heath Lane, Earl Shilton. It resulted in a vehicle being stopped in Stoney Stanton and police attending two address – Long Street, Stoney Stanton, and in High Street, Earl Shilton. The men are due to appear at Leicester Magistrates' Court.

PC Nik has been on the beat speaking with residents of Coniston Court, Earl Shilton in relation to concerns raised around Anti-Social Behaviour in the area. The beat team will increase patrols in the area as well as linking in with the Earl Shilton Neighbourhood Watch Scheme, so a Co-Ordinator can also help in a joint approach to tackle the issues that have been raised. If anyone currently suffers from ASB these issues can be reported to the Police, Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council or local Housing associations depending on the type of issues raised for a problem solving approach. Not all antisocial behaviour needs to be reported to us, other partners, such as local authorities, healthcare organisations and charities may lead on specific areas of ASB. If you report ASB via our website, you will be directed to the appropriate organisation that is relevant for your report.

We work with partner agencies such as local councils, housing and wellbeing services to tackle and prevent ASB using a problem solving approach to achieve the best results



Last month we hosted our first beat surgery at the Age UK Centre in Earl Shilton. We will be there again for another beat surgery on 13th March. After the beat surgery, patrols were completed by PCSO Reed and PC Nik. With the weather we have been having and are forecast we have seen an increase recently in RTC's. Over recent weeks, officers have continued targeted patrols across the beat in response to community concerns around drug dealing and drug use. High-visibility patrols have been conducted in key hotspot areas, including local parks, residential alleyways, and known gathering points. These patrols have resulted in several positive stop searches, intelligence submissions, and the seizure of small quantities of suspected Class B substances.
