We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in November 2023.

Priority 1: Shop Lifting

You said: Concerns with increased retail theft

What we are going to do: Priority patrols, Plain clothes patrols Targeting known areas of concern, developing intel, moni-

toring known perpetrators

Priority 2: ASB

You Said: Concerns regarding Anti social behaviour issues with persons climbing on roof tops of local businesses

What we are doing

Priority 1: Shop Lifting

Criminal gangs are targeting Hinckley town centre, officers have been conducting plain clothes operations over the Christmas period. There have been several successful arrests and Community resolution issued, banning them from the town and items retrieved .

Priority 2: ASB

Speaking with local business owners and working closely with our partner agencies

Some positive results around Retail Crime—4 x Community Resoltutions (CR) in one day for theft from retailers on the Crescent and store bans have been issued. One male has been charged and been given a suspended sentence for a number of thefts between December and February

One female has been charged for a number of theft offences in February andnis awaiting a court date.

Over the weekend there was a report of anti social behaviour with two males in town causing a nuisance to other members of the public. This resulted in one male being arrested for public order offences and CR issued however he continued to commit further offences just after the issue of the CR resulting in him being arrested and taken to custody. He has now been charged and a file has been submitted for him to appear in court

PC Gutteridge issued a community resolution for Cannabis possession after speaking with a male about his anti social bike riding on Castle Street

PC Liz and colleagues were actively patrolling the Town centre and whilst speaking with shoppers they met RENO, seemingly a famous dog in the town ..PC Liz couldn't miss the opportunity to get the handcuffs out. They were then called to an incident of youths seen breaking into a disused building words of advice given, then onto a RTC and then off again to continue with crime enquiries.

Officers from Leicestershire Police licencing, have attended a local retainer in Hinckley. Whilst in premises Officers seized a large amount of vapes, and e-cigarettes. These items fail to comply with UK regulations posing potential risks to users.

The total value of the items recovered is over £4000.00 The items recovered will be passed to Trading Standards for further investigation.
