#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to your concerns and prioritised the following in October 2025:

Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour

- **You Said:** Reports of anti-social behaviour around The Dales include youths throwing items at houses and knocking on doors.
- **Our Action:** Patrols of the The Dales have continued throughout October. We have seen a dramatic decrease in reports being made to us about anti-social behaviour.

Priority 2: Anti-Social Behaviour

- **You Said:** Retailers and security at the Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre have on-going problems with youths causing anti-social behaviour.
- **Our Action:** The beat team and a new team called the Safer Streets Team have completed high visibility patrols. Officers have engaged positively with youths and store staff during patrols, reinforcing community relationships and promoting a safe and welcoming environment.

Priority 3: Heathley Park

- **You Said:** Concerns over an increase in thefts from motor vehicles, burglaries and anti-social behaviour.
- **Our Action:** The beat team have been carrying out regular high visibility patrols across the area. These are aimed to maintain community reassurance and deter criminal activity.
