You said - We did

- Speeding (10 votes on Neighbourhood Link (NHL)). Between 01/01/2026 and 31/01/2026 the mobile speed camera visited Lubbenham Hill twice. In total twenty one offences were detected.
- Anti social behaviour (10 votes on NHL) - identifying individuals causing the anti social behaviour. Passing their names to the council to start the incremental approach. Targeting areas of known ASB activity.
- Drug dealing (11 votes on NHL) - We have been conducting plain clothes patrols in areas we are told drug dealing is an issue. We collect intelligence from residents and CrimeStoppers and apply for magistrates warrants and conduct drugs raids on those we suspect of dealing in drugs. We encourage anyone to report drug dealing to us anonymously through CrimeStoppers.

Recently one Friday evening, response officer PC Sophie Tweddle was joined on patrol by Deputy Chief Constable Michaela Kerr, seeing first-hand the challenges and fast pace of frontline policing. They were deployed to a report of a break-in in progress in Scraptoft. Thankfully, this turned out to be a call made with good intent, and after enquiries, no offences were disclosed. Soon afterwards they attended a concern for welfare in Fleckney. After speaking with those involved, they were satisfied there were no immediate concerns. Advice and guidance were provided, ensuring the individual knew where to seek support if needed. Finally, they attended an incident where enforcement officers were being threatened. The situation was resolved calmly and professionally, with the male ultimately paying his outstanding fine and the clamp being removed from his van. DCC Kerr enjoyed taking the time between jobs to have open and honest conversations with officers about the realities of response policing. It was greatly appreciated by the team. She is keen to come back out again soon.



A prolific offender who committed a series of burglaries across the force area, stealing several cars, was jailed on Friday (30 January). Between January and March last year Theo Ramsey stole nine cars after stealing the car keys from inside the properties. Offences were committed in Fleckney, Broughton Astley, Countesthorpe, Narborough, Leicester, Coalville, Syston, Belton, Market Harborough, Kirby Muxloe and Oakham. After a lengthy investigation, 19-year-old Ramsey formerly of New Fields Avenue, Leicester, was identified as being involved after CCTV enquiries and phone work placed him at the scene of the offences. Detective Constable Billie-Jo Kent was the investigating officer, she said: "The majority of the offences Ramsey committed were overnight while the occupants were asleep in their beds. The incidents were extremely distressing for the victims.
