What matters to you

From data collated from local surveys, beat knowledge, intelligence and reports made to Leicestershire Police, the following have been highlighted as priorities within the community.

Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB).

You said: General ASB is still an issue and continues across the beat.

We Did: Partnership working with the Leicester City Councils ASB team was conducted recently at an address believed to be involved in ASB, after speaking to the tenants a warning was issued and it appears the situation has been much improved.

Priority 2: Drug Dealing.

You said: Drug dealing, taking and cultivation is still happening in the local community.

We did: Officers seized cannabis from an individual in the Saffron Lane estate after they were stopped and searched after previously running away from officers who sighted them acting suspiciously. Officers caught up to the individual and found he was in possession of cannabis, they have been issued with a written warning and must adhere to other terms or else they will face possible prosecution.

Priority 3: Specific ASB.

You said: There has been an increase in ASB in the Old Saffron Lane/Maris Lane area.

We did: Issues in this area have been significantly reduced recently but there have still been some reports. Officers have been able to identify several individuals involved after speaking to residents, businesses and working with local schools. Patrols in the area are set to continue and those involved have been spoken to and warned about their behaviour.

Other Local News

A cannabis grow was located at an address in the Aylestone Road area after a report was made by a high court warrant officer who was at the property for an unrelated matter. When inside many plants were discovered and it was confirmed the address was being used to cultivate. All equipment and cannabis have been seized and destroyed with an investigation under way to identify those involved.

I will be at the Church of the Nativity in July (full details below), please if you did want to speak directly to a member of the local team about any issues/community concerns you may have or if you have any policing questions then please do come along. Crime prevention advice will be available, and I can discuss any policing matters with you and inform you on how the local team are addressing our current beat priorities.

Sadly, we have seen an increase of mopeds being stolen across the South Leicester area which SGT Nathan Birkin recently raised in a post on our designated Facebook page.
