#YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park, Cort Crescent and Gallards Hill

You said: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in and around Braunstone Park and Cort Crescent has again been identified as a priority concern from the community and now with the lighter nights arriving we will continue to target and focus on this area of concern.

We Did: We have continued to provide hot-spot patrols and re-assurance over this last month. Whilst there is still ASB in the park there has for the third month in a row been a significant reduction in offences relating to items being thrown at vehicles. We mentioned last month, we mentioned that we had seen an increase in the number of small grass fires being set within the park itself. We are happy to report that the reports for this have dropped off, with there being no reports over the last month.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You Said: Road Safety has been highlighted to be a local concern for our Beat. As such we will continue to keep this as a priority and Speeding vehicles has been identified as being one of the main points of concern within the community.

We Did: Vehicles have been seized from our Beat area for NO TAX using powers provided to the Police under DVLA guidance. We have continued to seize vehicles being driven on our roads without valid Insurance or Drivers Licences. We have been conducting speed enforcement checks with our speed camera at identified hotspots such as Evesham Road and Dumbleton Avenue within the community and are glad to report on our visits only advice has been issued to a few as most people were driving at safe speeds.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour (Drug related)

You Said: From the Surveys on Neighbourhood Link you have told us that drug dealing and usage at addresses across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is your top concern and problem that you want us to keep focus on - so we are!

We Did: As promised we have carried on with targeting those people or addresses that are concerned in the use or supply of illegal drugs. 2 Section 8 PACE Warrants have been executed at addresses—one on Mountcastle Road and the other on Raymond Road—where Cannabis Farms were located at both addresses. Two persons were detained from both addresses, both having been interviewed and investigations continuing. The estimated value is around £200,000 across both addresses.

Good news

We would like to introduce our new Braunstone & Rowley Fields Sergeant to you!!

Sergeant Craig Turner has over 20 years of Policing experience under his belt, including 10 years in neighbourhood policing.

He comes to us from the response unit based at Beaumont Leys, so he already has experience of the ward and was recently the caretaker Sergeant of the Western Ward.

Community Policing and multi agency working has always been at the forefront of Sgt Turner's policing career and he looks forward to meeting member's of the community and helping to tackle and problem solve any issues that you identify.

June has been another busy month for the team;

- Whilst at the beat surgery, PCSO's Beth and Julie were informed that a male was at an address breaching his restraining order. They went to conduct a welfare check on the resident. Whilst they were at they address, the found the male had left the back of the address and was in breach of his restraining order. George and Chelsea attended the location and arrested this male. The male was also outstanding for a recall to prison. This male was sent to court the next morning and sentenced for the restraining order and is now back in prison.
- After PC Chelsea's hard work and dedication, she has obtained a partial closure order in relation to an address on Haworth Place. This is valid until early September.
- PCSOs Beth, Julie and Geoff attended Caldecote Primary School at the start of the month. They
 held sessions with pupils from Year 1—showing them around a police van, trying on some uniform,
 and listening to the sirens. This also gave them the chance to explain the role of Police Officers and
 PCSOs.
- PCSOs Julie and Beth attended a local secondary school in the hopes of identifying two youths in relation to the possession of a bladed article. Both have been identified and will be dealt with.
