



Lighter Evenings Advice

As we approach the spring season where lighter evenings upon us, this heightens the opportunity to burglaries. Leicestershire Police is committed to keeping our communities safe, key Crime Prevention Advice with the aim keep you and your property safe is a top priority for the Neighbourhood beat team.

Remember to test your burglar alarm and set this should you go away for a well deserved holiday. Keep your doors and windows closed when you are not in the room, preventing easy access to an opportunist criminal.

Think carefully about what you post on social media about going on holiday, more importantly, when you post about being away and highlighting that your house is empty. Could that post wait until you are nearly home?

This advice extends to any notices you leave out for deliveries showing that someone is not in your house.

Could your side gate, shed, garages or outhouses benefit with a new or upgraded lock - this could be one step that prevents a burglary.

In order to maximise your own security, it is always good advice to take a look at your property from the outside and review what can be seen. What is on show that would interest a burglar or highlight vulnerabilities in your properties security?

A box left beside the bin could be showing a new expensive purchase in your house. A high fence or overgrown bush could provide enough cover for someone to try the front door out of sight from the road. Is fitting CCTV to your property an option?

Any one of these steps followed could be just enough to prevent a burglary, but by following every step you put yourself in the best possible position.

With the lighter evenings on us, Anti-Social Behaviour is likely to increase and the neighbourhood team will be increasing patrols of the shopping centre supporting staff and the public enjoying the location.

Knife Crime Reduction

A National Increase in knife crime has been identified and the neighbourhood team are both proactively targeting those that cause most harm and educating young people around the dangers of knife crime.


What has the Beat Team been up to?

The neighbourhood team has been very busy all across the Beaumont Leys beat area this month. Throughout the month of April with both investigations of crime and community engagements.

E - Scooters

Plenty of proactive patrols from the beat team have been carried out to tackle the issues of E-Scooter around Beaumont leys this month. Officers have been stopping E-scooters and advising, educating and in some circumstances seizing E-scooters. As a reminder,

- E-scooters are illegal
- Warnings against the E-scooter and person can and have been issued
- If on the second time the E-scooter is



stopped the vehicle will be seized

Castle Hill Country Park

This month there was an incident on Castle Hill Country Park, whereby a dog walker was assaulted on the park. The beat team has prioritised this incident and there is an on going investigation. Regular patrols have been conducted and many members of the public have been spoken to in and around the park for reassurance regarding the incident.
