PC Az and PCSO Raja are also conducted school engagements such as Assembly's Discussing online safety, riding bikes safely and work shops so the children can have a insight on what policing really is and how this helps the community with a positive attitude

Speeding operation

Ongoing collaboration between your local team and the Rushy Mead beat team - consisting of Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers (DNOs), PCSOs & Special Constables to identify and deter speeders on Gipsy Lane and Peebles way. We would like to remind you how important it is for everybody in the community to come together

and keep our children safe. A number of traffic operations are being conducted in the area.

The beat team have been out and about, acting in your area, dealing robustly with those speeding and committing driving offences, in an effort to improve road safety. This will continue.

Recent speed operations mentioned have been successful with large numbers of drivers being prosecuted for driving offences.

Beat officers will be providing patrols at local schools at key times to improve the safety of pupils, parents and road users.
