Welcome to your Uppingham police e-newsletter. Here you will find all of the latest news from an Uppingham policing perspective .

### What matters to you



We have listened to you and the concerns you have raised through surveys, community consultations and analysing crime trends. Using this data, we have created the following Uppingham Town priorities that the Dedicated Neighbourhood Team will focus their efforts on:

Priority 1: Road Safety. You said: Speeding vehicles on Rutland roads is a priority you want us to address, specifically the lack of adherence to 30mph zones. What we are going to do: We will complete high

visibility patrols of hotpot areas with partner agencies and deal proactively with offenders with a view to providing suitable advice or action where required.

Priority 2: Drugs. You Said: Drug dealing as well as drug use in the area. We are going to do develop our intelligence picture around those who commit this type of crime so we that we can effectively target our resources in the right areas, at the right time, with the aim of deterring, disrupting and bringing offenders to justice.

Priority 3: Anti-Social Behaviour. You said: Specific issues of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) concerning individuals in the community, 'nuisance neighbours' and irresponsible dog ownership / walking is an area you want us to focus on. What we are going to do: We will provide a frequent high visibility policing presence, as part of a localised operation around Road Safety, to the affected areas with marked vehicle patrols and regular monitoring. We will deploy the speed gun device and deal with offenders robustly where appropriate. We will also continue to work with partner agencies, such as the Road Safety Partnership mobile speed camera van, to identify areas of concern and request deployment of that resource. We will then continue to publish the enforcement statistics on the Neighbourhood Link messaging service.

I am sure you will join me in thanking him for his help over the past year and wish him well in his new role in Melton.

#### **Crime Trends and Prevention Advice**

I am pleased to say that overall crime on the beat is still low and we've only had one incident of Anti-Social Behaviour reported on the beat over the last month. Unfortunately, we have had a Burglary (Commercial) which is the second in two months. A burglary with a similar MO taking place just off our area only an hour later. These incidents have been linked and the investigation of the is ongoing. With the clocks having just gone back and the darker nights setting in, it is crucial to review the security of your own property/business premises. Please help us to help you, by doing what you can to deter, detect, deny and delay any potential offenders. In simple terms, this can be as straight forward as installing additional locks, lighting, alarms and CCTV. Or checking that existing systems in place are working correctly. Please report suspicious activity to the Police by calling 101, or 999 if there is a crime in action, or an emergency. Thank you.
