Three Main Priorities

The three main priorities your neighbourhood team are currently focusing on aside from reported incidents and other on-going matters are:

ASB around Aikman Flats

Patrols have been taking place by the local Beat team and those responsible have been given Acceptable Behaviour Contracts in a bid to change their conduct. These contracts will be monitored for compliance.

Disorder/Illegal Bikes in Bonney Road Area

Patrols have been increased in the area and so far 4 motorcycles have been seized from the street and residential properties. Liaison with Leicester City Council has occurred and a professionals meeting is planned for May.



Road Safety Increase

Planned operations in Uniform and plain clothes have already been completed and will continue to take place in the coming months.

These can be for incidents involving animal welfare, as well as when a dog might go for a wander without their owner knowing. 
Recovering Illegal Vehicles

A common update we know, but the Beat Team have continued to look for illegal vehicles in our area. Whether this be because of them being involved in crime, illegally being on the road or stolen from their owners. We want to make sure the vehicles on the roads, are ones that should be there.



Beat Team Helping Each Other

We try to work as much as possible on our beat area, but sometimes we are needed to help our colleagues on other areas. In return, they come over to the Western Ward to help with any issues we might have. Our officers have helped with arrests across West Leicester, but West Leicester officers have also come over to us to help with ASB issues in our area.



Non-Uniformed Patrols

Officers have been starting early throughout the month due to reports of issues within the parks in the early hours. This has meant officers going out, not in uniform, in order to identify those causing harm.

What is a Beat Surgery?

A Beat Surgery is a planned public meeting where officers from our neighbourhood team will post a date, time and location within the beat area and allow members of the public to raise their concerns, ask any questions or report matters to their neighbourhood team directly.
