What matters to you

From data collated from local surveys, beat knowledge, intelligence and reports made to Leicestershire Police, the following have been highlighted as priorities within the community.

Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB).

You said: General ASB is still an issue and continues across the beat.

We did: Two residents were issued with verbal warnings after reports of repeat ASB, one was isolated to the communal area of flat block and the other involved a group of people causing issues on the street in the Saffron Lane estate. After the warnings were issued there have been no further reports made to police.

Priority 2: Drug use and supply.

You said: Drug dealing, taking and cultivation is still happening in the local community.

We did: A cannabis grow was recently located in the Lansdowne Road area, the property has been cleared with a large amount of cannabis plants seized and other cultivation equipment destroyed. An investigation is now under way to identify those involved with the address made safe and secure.

Priority 3: That there is ASB around the Knighton Lane East area, including the opens space areas.

You said: We did: Patrols in this area have been conducted by the local team, there has been a decrease in reports made to us in these locations, but a high visibility presence will continue especially as we approach bonfire night.

Other Local News

At the start of the month PCSO Michelle Holton joined the South Leicester team after completing her initial training at force headquarters, Michelle will be completing her in company period on the Freeman beat with the intention being that she will remain on the team once given her independent status.

It has been a busy month for Michelle since arriving she has been to local events, held beat surgeries and has been out introducing herself to the local community. We have visited the craft group at the Kingfisher Youth Centre, visited key locations on the beat such as the Aylestone Leisure Centre and the Saffron Resource Centre. We attended the recent Saffron Ward Meeting where we were able to offer those in attendance a policing update and discuss issues effecting the community. Last week we seized two stolen vehicles that were located on Keble Road after being discovered there by the local council. Michelle has said that she is looking forward to serving the community, being a visible and reassuring presence on the beat for many years to come.
