Road safety including nuisance motorbikes, speeding, and highway obstructions.	A number of inconsiderate parking reports have been taken in various locations this month. Although not technically illegal if they are causing a safety concern then the vehicle can be removed. Luckily all reported vehicles did move on before removal was considered.

News

The Leicester Forest East, Kirby Muxloe and Glenfield beat team have recently had a number of reports of drug related anti-social behaviour particularly in the Glenfield area, in a number of car parks where evidence of nitrous oxide has been found. The beat team are monitoring these locations and will deal with perpetrators as and when they are caught. Do you struggle with an addiction to drugs or alcohol? There is a partner agency the police work with that will provide help and support to anyone struggling with such addictions. This agency is called Turning Point and as well as substance misuse they can also provide help and support with mental health, learning disabilities, sexual health and people who want to stop smoking. You can self refer and the service is free and confidential.

A number of ECINS reports have been created this month in relation to antisocial behaviour. ECINS is our anti-social behaviour recording system which allows us to keep a running log of a particular anti social behaviour problem. Complaints such as drug related ASB in Glenfield; the play park near to the parish hall in Kirby Muxloe has had drug paraphernalia found on frequent occasions and a report of males smoking cannabis at a property in Glenfield are all matters we are currently investigating.

A vehicle, stolen from the driveway of a property in Leicester Forest East was recovered within 11 minutes of the owner realising it had been taken from his driveway. The vehicle was located in the Westcotes area just off of Fosse Road Central. Luckily the owner had hidden a tracking device within the vehicle and was able to tell Officers its location. The vehicle was forensically recovered. We are conducting proactive patrols.

Are you sick and tired of receiving telephone marketing calls? If yes, why not sign up to the telephone preference service! The Telephone Preference Service (TPS) is the UK's only official 'Do Not Call' register for landlines and Mobile numbers. It allows people and businesses to opt out of unsolicited live sales and marketing calls. It's free and quick to register a telephone number. Doing so will reduce the amount of unwanted sales and marketing calls you receive. There is also a register for businesses, the Corporate Telephone Preference Service. If a number is registered with the TPS/CTPS, organisations are legally required – by the Privacy and Electronic (EC Directive) Regulations 2003 – to refrain from calling it. In the UK, the Information Commissioner's Office enforces the law and has power to fine firms that break it. You can register on their website at: <https://leicspolice.link/evWdp>.
