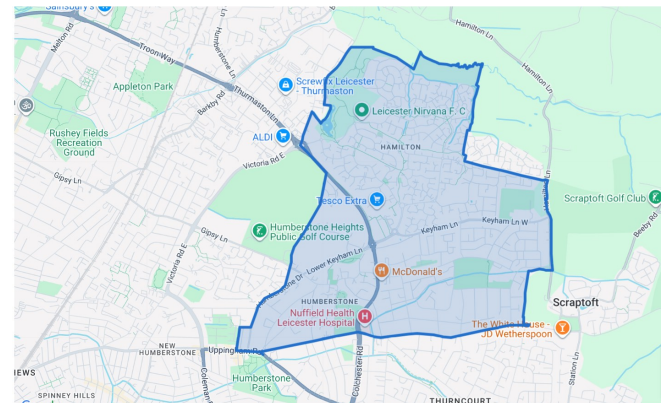
## Neighbourhood Link

### Youths Causing Anti Social behaviour:

Our team has recently been dealing with an increase in anti-social behaviour involving local youths in and around the McDonald's on Netherhall Road. We want to reassure the community that we have taken firm and proactive steps to address these concerns. Officers have been engaging directly with the young people involved and have contacted their parents to ensure they are fully aware of the behaviour taking place. Formal warning letters have also been issued, outlining the potential consequences should this behaviour continue. We remain committed to keeping the area safe and welcoming for everyone, and we will continue to work closely with parents, local businesses, and community partners to prevent further issues.

### Residential breaks and burglaries:

As the nights grow longer, it's important to take extra precautions to keep your home secure. Ensure all doors and windows are locked, even when you're at home, and consider using timer switches for lights to give the impression that someone is in. Avoid leaving valuables in plain sight and keep sheds and garages locked. If you have a security alarm or CCTV, make sure it's working properly. Most importantly, stay alert to suspicious activity in your area and report anything unusual to the police. A few simple steps can make a big difference in keeping your home and family safe.

## Day in the life of Police community support Officers

PCSOs **6102** and **6020** recently had a varied and productive shift, supporting the community across several incidents:

- **CCTV Tasking:** Assisting with ongoing enquiries by reviewing local CCTV
- **Flood-Related Road Closure:** Managing a closure to keep motorists and pedestrians safe during heavy rain.
- **Loose Horses on Watermead Park:** Responding to escaped horses and ensuring they were safely reunited with their owner.
- **Welfare Check:** Checking on a resident after reports of anti-social behaviour and offering reassurance and support.

Each day brings different challenges, but our priority remains the same — keeping the community safe, supported, and reassured.

Fatal Four Operation at Tesco, Hamilton

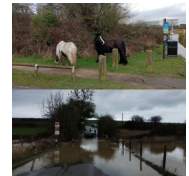
East Leicester Neighbourhood officers — **PC 1026, PC 1009, PCSO 6020 and PCSO 6563** — joined colleagues from the Leicestershire Police Traffic Department and Special Constabulary to take part in a **Fatal Four** operation at Tesco, Hamilton. During the operation, several drivers were stopped and spoken to for key road safety offences, including:

**Failing to wear a seatbelt** (drivers and passengers)

**Using a mobile phone while driving**

Those found committing offences have been **reported accordingly**.
