What matters to you

We have identified the following priorities which are in place as of 1st January 2026:

- **Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)**

You Said: Police are working to reduce ongoing ASB particularly involving young people. This includes increased patrols in hotspot areas, early intervention, and enforcement action against repeat offenders to prevent further disruption to residents.

We Did: We have continued to tackle issues around Royston Close, where a group of youths have been repeatedly targeting an address, as well as being a general nuisance in the wider area. Last month, two arrests were made in relation to this and bail conditions were put in place. Both youths have now also been issued with warning letters, in line with the incremental approach we use for tackling ASB.

- **Priority 2: Drug Dealing**

You Said: Drug dealing continues to be a prevalent issue locally.

We Did: We are progressing partnership work with Leicester City Council in relation to tenancy enforcement and potential closure orders where evidence thresholds are met. Intelligence development remains ongoing, and we encourage residents to continue providing information confidentially via 101 or Crimestoppers.


- **Priority 3: Improving Community Safety**

You Said: Improving community safety remains important, with officers increasing their visibility through regular foot patrols. Police are engaging with residents to provide reassurance, respond to concerns, and build trust within the local community.

We Did: Local officers have increased patrols in and around the estate to deter issues in problem areas. We are also working with partner agencies to identify longer-term solutions to recurring issues raised by residents. Your local neighbourhood team remains committed to being visible, accessible and responsive to community concerns.

Other Local News

- Local officers have been made aware of continued issues at a renovation site on SAFFRON LANE. We are monitoring this situation and will deal with any persons identified as causing issues appropriately.
- We have had a good result with an address on GLENHILLS BOULEVARD, which had been subject to a closure order, which has now been repossessed by Leicester City Council. After renovations, this can be given to a far more deserving member of the Eyres Monsell Community!
