#YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park, Cort Crescent and Gallards Hill

You said: Anti-Social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park continues as a priority concern from the community. With Halloween and Bonfire night approaching, the team will continue to concentrate on this location.

We Did: Over the summer period, the team worked closely with LFRS to conduct high visibility joint operations at the location to educate and engage with the community. This has resulted in less reports of arson than previous summers.

The team have also submitted a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) application, which will enhance the area and give the team more powers to deal with local issues.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You Said: From Community Surveys and Feedback on Neighbourhood Link, road safety has been highlighted to be a local concern. We will continue to concentrate on speeding concerns and anti social behaviour caused by e bikes, e scooters and off road motorbikes.

We Did: The team have now conducted 5 Op Pedalfast operations in Braunstone and Rowley Fields. This has resulted in 33 e-scooters and 24 e-bikes being seized since 22nd August. It has also resulted in a stolen motorbike being recovered, a stolen bike being recovered and multiple arrests for other offences. Your feedback has been very positive and we will continue to take illegal vehicles off the roads and footpaths. The team have also executed our first tester speed enforcement operation on Gooding Avenue. Again, this has produced good feedback from the community and will look at upping the number of those operations.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour (Drug related)

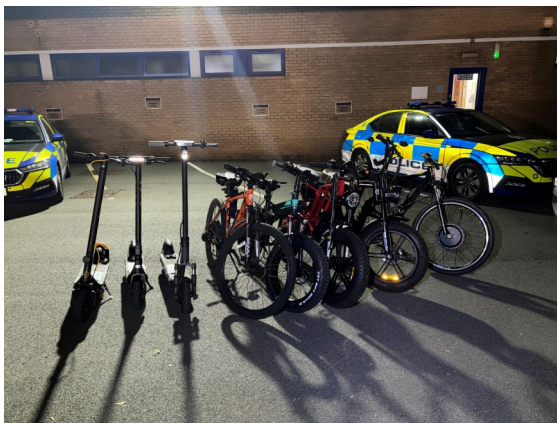
You Said: From the Surveys on Neighbourhood Link you have told us that drug dealing and usage at locations across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is a concern.

We Did: For the year to date, the team have executed 8 Misuse of Drugs Act warrants this year. This is based on the information that you, the community tell us about. This is in addition to multiple arrests that occur for drugs related offences across the beat. The team continue to receive vital information, which we are grateful for and is a result of the trust that we continue to build.

Good news

Here is a few of October's activities;

- Operation Pedalfast have continued in Braunstone and Rowley Fields. This has resulted in 33 e-scooters and 24 e-bikes being seized since 22nd August. The feedback from local residents and visitors to the area has been extremely positive, and we hope you can see a difference in the numbers!
- PCs from the Safer Streets team attended an address on Bennett Walk for a cuckooing visit. 3 people were located at the address but one person did not want to hang around and speak to officers. The detained persons were searched, where drugs were located along with a substantial amount of cash. They were lodged for the night at custody! A further search of the address found further drugs (Class A and Class B0 as well as other items linked to criminality. The investigation continues!
- At the end of September, a stolen electric bike was recovered by the beat team. We are pleased to share that the pushbike has been reunited with it's owner! The bike was identified and recovered after being flagged on the Bike Register. We highly recommend—if you haven't already—register your push bike with Bike Register.
