3 MONTH PRIORITIES - Month 1

What matters to you?

PRIORITY: ASB ST MATTHEWS

There have been reports of anti-social behaviour in and around the Willow Street area, involving large groups who are gathering at the location causing issues.

PRIORITY: SPINNEY HILL PARK

Now that the darker evenings are approaching there are concerns around the possible increase of ASB, thefts, assaults and general issues within Spinney Hill Park.

PRIORITY: DRUG DEALING

We have received reports from the public that drug dealing is taken place within the Highfields area.

What we are doing?

ACTION: ASB ST MATTHEWS

Patrols in the area have increased including the courtyards and stairwells. We will be liaising with the Council regarding any tenants who may be causing issues.

ACTION: SPINNEY HILL PARK

Your beat team will increase their patrols of the park during the darker nights as a deterrent to offending.

ACTION: DRUG DEALING

Your beat team and our proactive team will be patrolling the area 24 hours a day, gathering intelligence and conducting stop searches of persons found to be dealing
