



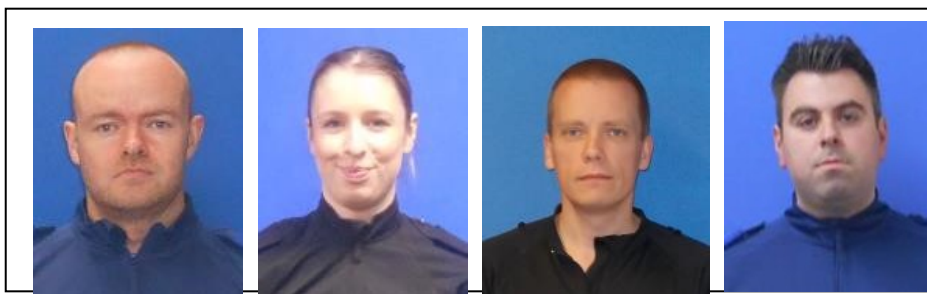

Anti-Social Behaviour at the Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre

ASB patrols have been conducted in and around the Beaumont Leys shopping centre. We are pleased to announce there has been a noticeable reduction in ASB reports and sightings this week. PCSO 6644 and PCSO 6527 have conducted a beat surgery held on the 19/01/2024 within the shopping centre to engage with the local public and speak about any concerns they may have.

- Housing patch walk has been conducted where by residence, council housing officers and the police all attended to discuss issues on their road on the Beaumont beat

- Targeted overnight patrols in our hotspot areas, as well as the previously mention OP which involves stopping suspicious vehicles and vans that may be related to the ongoing issue of vans in the area being broken in to and tools being removed.
- Reports followed up regarding XL Bullies with no certification have been contacted
- Continued work with housing and the community safety team in relation to on-going community issues.
- A known youth offender was arrested and interviewed in relation to their behaviour on the Beaumont beat

Beat Surgeries in your area:

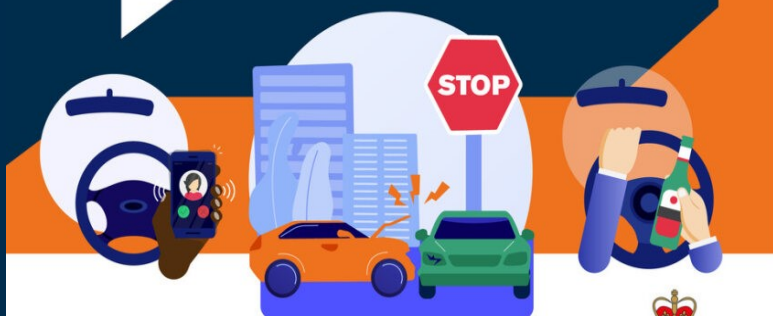
What is a Beat Surgery?
