We have listened to you and the concerns you raised:

You said: Drug users / dealing, and the crime associated with it are causing you concern.

What we are going to do: Whilst we will robustly deal with those who break the law, we will also seek to engage with the drug users in order to understand what factors are driving them to this lifestyle and what interventions we can offer.

You Said: Anti-social behaviour is causing you a concern.

What we are going to do: Identify those that are responsible and deal with them accordingly via the ASB incremental approach.

You said: Speeding and road safety on the beat is a concern for you.

What we are going to do: The speed enforcement vehicle as part of the Road Safety Partnership continues to attend locations on the beat.

## #WeDid—What we are doing continued

**Collaborative Efforts:** We've been working with Melton Town beat and Melton Borough Council to enforce closure notices. Our team has also supported response colleagues on live incidents, leading to several arrests, including a male suspect in a burglary case who is now out on bail while investigations continue.

**Cicle Classic Race:** On Sunday, April 27th, we assisted with the Cicle Classic race in Oakham. Our team helped marshals, supported temporary road closures, and engaged with the public. The sunny weather made it a fantastic day!

**Community Engagement:** PCSO Sal has been covering shifts at the front enquiry office at Melton Police Station and arranging more beat engagements for the area. Check the details at the bottom of this newsletter and join us at the upcoming events!

**Ongoing Investigations:** We're investigating indecent exposures that occurred on April 22nd at Kirby Fields park, a play area on Thrush Close, and Dieppe Way. If you saw or heard anything unusual, please come forward. We've issued CCTV images of a man who may have information about the incidents. - We continue to deal with local issues such as Anti-social behaviour and safeguard vulnerable residents and cuckooing victims as and when we identify concerns.
- We are aware of the ongoing issue of HGV vehicles breaching weight restriction zones on Craven Street and surrounding roads. We are looking at different ways to manage this however it will be another one of our patrol locations.
- Our work is ongoing with local schools including engagement events
- And lastly as 'Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers' we continue to work on and try find solutions with neighbour disputes. We also support our response colleagues and cover the front enquiry office too.
