What matters to you:

Priority 1: You told us that you were concerned about burglaries within the Oadby area.

What we are doing: Officers continue to conduct regular patrols of the areas where offences have occurred, these patrols are reducing the number of burglaries. We will continue to do this going forward. Where CCTV is available, this will provide valuable intelligence on times and when offences are happening and possible vehicles involved, to assist in our patrol strategy.

Priority 2: Road Safety You said: You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance, MOT and driving offences.

What we are doing: We have conducted vehicle speed checks at identified locations. Local officers have been targeting motorists' speeding, not wearing seatbelts, using mobile phones and drink/drug driving. Local officers have received reports of identified vehicles being driven without valid insurance, MOT and tax.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour You Said: You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and reduce their occurrences.

What we are doing: Your local police beat team and response officers continue to patrol identified locations, as reported by yourselves with regards to anti-social behaviour and drug related incidents. Officers continue to stop check persons and vehicles who are involved in drugs. Local officers have identified vehicles which are related to criminality.

Burglary Update

Police volunteers have been supporting the Oadby Policing Team by identifying homes left in darkness while the occupants are away, as part of the Darker Nights initiative. If you are heading out, please remember to leave a light on, it's a simple but effective way to help protect your property. Thanks to ongoing patrols and crime-prevention work by both the Oadby Neighbourhood Policing Team and our dedicated Police Volunteers, we have seen a reduction in potential burglaries.

Tackling Drug Activity and Anti-Social Behaviour

Our neighbourhood policing teams are maintaining regular patrols in areas known for drug-related concerns and anti-social behaviour. Thanks to proactive work and information shared by the community, we have identified several individuals involved in these activities and have taken appropriate enforcement action. Your reports continue to play a vital role, if you see anything suspicious, please let us know so we can respond quickly and effectively.

Speeding Checks Across Oadby

Officers are continuing targeted speed checks throughout Oadby following concerns raised by residents. Identified drivers that exceeded speed limits or driving irresponsibly were issued penalties. These operations form part of our ongoing commitment to improving road safety for everyone, which includes drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists alike.

Patrols on The Parade

During January 2026 PCSO Nad carried out extended foot patrols along The Parade in Oadby, spending time engaging with local shop managers and retail staff. It was valuable to speak with businesses directly, hear their current concerns, and understand the specific challenges they are facing on a day-to-day basis. PCSO Nad discussed a range of local issues that are particularly important to our business community right now, including recent incidents of shoplifting, concerns around anti-social behaviour, and ways we can work together to create a safer environment for staff and customers.
