What matters to you:

Our Beat Priorities continue to be shaped by information provided by residents through meetings, reports, and day-to-day conversations with officers.

Burglary

Burglaries have been raised as the top priority for South Wigston.

Road Safety

General road safety and speeding are frequently raised as a priority locally.

Antisocial Behaviour

ASB – specifically illegal and dangerous motorcycles, have been raised as a concern

What we have done #yousaidwedid

Burglary

You Said

Residents told us they were concerned about burglaries and attempted break-ins across South Wigston, particularly during early evening and overnight hours. Many of you reported worries about insecure sheds, garages, and homes being targeted.

We Did

Conducted high-visibility patrols in burglary hotspot areas, including evening and overnight patrols. Carried out targeted reassurance visits to affected streets following reported incidents. Worked with neighbouring teams to identify repeat offending patterns. Provided crime-prevention advice to residents, focusing on home security, lighting, and property marking. Engaged with local partners and housing providers to address insecure communal areas.

We are happy to report that there have been **0** reported burglaries in April in South Wigston.

Road Safety – Speeding

You Said

Many residents raised concerns about vehicles speeding through residential roads, particularly near schools, junctions, and pedestrian crossing points. You told us this behaviour made streets feel unsafe for children, cyclists, and pedestrians.

We Did

Carried out speed-monitoring activity at locations identified by the community. Conducted traffic enforcement patrols, focusing on speeding and poor driving behaviour. Issued warnings and enforcement action where appropriate. Liaised with the local authority to share intelligence around road layout and signage concerns. Continued to monitor problem areas to inform future patrol activity.

We also installed a new ANPR speed monitoring sign in South Wigston – this was unfortunately vandalised and has been sent for repair but will be back very soon.



Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB), including E-Bike Use

You Said

Residents reported ongoing anti-social behaviour including groups causing noise and nuisance, and concerns around the unsafe and illegal use of e-bikes, particularly on parks and footpaths.

We Did

Increased foot and bicycle patrols in ASB hotspot areas at peak times.

Engaged directly with individuals involved, using early intervention and education where appropriate.

Took positive action when offences were identified, including the use of ASB powers.

Conducted e-bike checks, focusing on illegal use, rider behaviour, and safety concerns.

Worked alongside partner agencies, youth services, and council teams to provide longer-term solutions.



Working With the Community

During April, officers have continued to engage with residents, local businesses, and community groups across South Wigston. These conversations are vital in shaping where and how we focus our resources.
