Your Dedicated Neighbourhood Team (DNT) is a group of local Officers dedicated to serving your community. The team is made up of Officers based in your area, supported by the wider Policing family.

Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid

You Said	We did
The NH20 beat has issues with Anti-Social Behaviour across Enderby, Narborough, Littlethorpe, New Lubbethorpe and Fosse Park. Anti-Social Behaviour involving the use of e-bikes, e-scooters in public spaces. This issue also covers rowdy and inconsiderate behaviours from individuals or groups in the area.	The beat team are continuing to investigate incidents of anti-social behaviour at McDonalds at Fosse Park. This usually consists of vehicles driving dangerously and inconsiderately in the car park. We are also managing issues relating to youths being rowdy and abusing the outdoor spaces at Narborough Park. Multiple perpetrators have been identified and are being dealt with appropriately. All incidents of ASB are treated and dealt with seriously and robustly.
Road Safety has been identified as a beat priority from Neighbourhood Link consultation and surveys with residents on the beat. Road Safety issues we face across the beat include things like speeding, improper use of the highway such as anti-social driving, road traffic collisions (RTC) and driving without tax, MOT or insurance.	Reports of Motorbikes on Tay Road causing a nuisance, if you have any information where these may be coming from please let the beat team know , our details are on the police website.
From Neighbourhood Link consultations, drug misuse and drug dealing have been identified as beat priorities. The use and distribution of drugs around the beat area has been identified as a priority. This includes issues surrounding the use of drugs and incidents caused by drug use, and also the effects of drug dealing in the beat area.	We are currently addressing concerns relating to drug dealing and drug misuse within the local area. While we are unable to provide specific details we can confirm we have received intelligence regarding the supply of drugs on the beat and are taking appropriate action.

News

Reports of ongoing Anti social behaviour, regarding the underage drinking in and around Narborough park have continued. There will be a few operations coming up to tackle this, along with our Licensing team. PC Abby has been very busy with visits to certain premises and gathering as much evidence as we can to tackle this issue. As well as this we are also experiencing issues on Narborough park and Littlethorpe in relation to fires being set at the location. We have had some CCTV footage with clear pictures and lots of names have been put forward, in the coming weeks these young people will be visited and dealt with.



Residents in Tay road in New Lubbesthorpe are facing some difficulties regarding motorbikes causing a nuisance, if you have any information where these may be coming from please let the beat team know, our details are on the police website.

Officers are making enquires into young people playing 'knock door run' on Coventry Road, Narborough and some of the surrounding streets late at night. CCTV has been collected and we are awaiting to ID the males caught on camera. People may think this is a harmless bit of fun, and we all used to do it growing up, but sometimes this is at the detriment to people with vulnerabilities and young children. Babies and small children are being woken up and vulnerable residents are becoming distressed. As we are now into the Summer Holidays we would appreciate any parent whose children are out playing to make them aware and advise them against this.
