E-scooters are being used to cause anti-social behaviour in Earl Shilton, by riding on the pedestrian footpaths.	See below for details.
Motorcross bikes are being used in an anti-social manner around the areas of Mill Lane and the Quarry.	As above. We will continue to patrol areas highlighted by residents and take action where necessary to help keep our communities safe. Thank you to everyone who continues to report concerns to us. Your information helps us identify issues and target our patrols where they are needed most.
Youths are acting in an anti-social manner on Wood Street Park, with reports of them drinking, fighting, setting fires, and causing damage to fences.	Patrols have significantly increased over the past few weeks after reports of youths causing fires at the location. The issue is being actively addressed, the measures currently in place to prevent further occurrences include, increased patrols, engagement with residents and partner agencies, and ongoing monitoring of the area.

News

The council and PC 343 carried out a patch walk in the Queen Street and Chapel Street area of Barwell this month, engaging with residents and addressing concerns raised through community reporting. During the walk, several residents were spoken to regarding local issues, including reports of suspected cannabis use. Appropriate advice was provided where necessary, focusing on the impact of anti-social behaviour on neighbours and the wider community. The team also gathered community feedback from local residents, many of whom reported no significant concerns, while others provided information to assist with ongoing neighbourhood problem-solving. Patch walks remain an important opportunity for officers to engage directly with residents, listen to local concerns, provide reassurance, and support safer communities.

One of our Response Officers carried out school patrols in the local area, engaging with parents, carers and other members of the public during busy school pick-up and drop-off times. During the patrol, the officer took the opportunity to speak with several motorists about parking safely and considerately around schools. While most drivers park responsibly, dangerous or inconsiderate parking can create significant risks for children, parents and other road users. Parking on pavements, obstructing crossings, blocking visibility near junctions, or stopping in restricted areas can make it difficult for children to safely see and be seen when crossing the road. These actions can increase the likelihood of a collision and put young pedestrians at unnecessary risk.



PCSO Ebonie carried out targeted patrols in the area of Earl Shilton to address concerns raised by the community about e-scooters and motorbikes being used anti-socially. During her patrols she located and recovered a stolen motorbike and stopped a person riding an e-scooter. We will continue to patrol areas highlighted by residents and take action where necessary to help keep our communities safe.
